Rental adjustments of Cheung Sha Wan Wholesale Food Market and Western Wholesale Food Market

## **Purpose**

This paper provides background information on government wholesale food markets and Members' concerns about wholesale food market rental

## Background

2. The Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation Department ("AFCD") manages four government wholesale food markets, namely Cheung Sha Wan Wholesale Food Market, Western Wholesale Food Market, Cheung Sha Wan Temporary Wholesale Poultry Market ("Poultry Market") and North District Temporary Wholesale Market for Agricultural Products ("NDT Wholesale Market"). According to AFCD Report 2010-2011, these four markets provided some 2 600 trading stalls and related ancillary facilities. A large part (about 37.2%) of the fresh food produce (e.g. vegetables, freshwater fish, eggs, fruits and live poultry) consumed locally was distributed through these markets. Details of the provision of facilities and the market throughput in the four wholesale food markets are in **Appendix I**.

## **Concerns raised at Council meeting**

- 3. An oral question regarding the rental adjustments of the Cheung Sha Wan Wholesale Food Market and the Western Wholesale Food Market was raised by Hon Vincent FANG at the Legislative Council ("LegCo") meeting of 2 July 2008. In response to the Member's enquiry about the substantial increase in the rentals for stalls in the aforesaid two markets starting from 1 June 2008, the Secretary for Food and Health ("SFH") advised that given their different backgrounds, the four wholesale food markets managed by AFCD operated under different rent adjustment mechanisms.
- 4. According to SFH, the management of NDT Wholesale Market had been outsourced to a private company. As NDT Wholesale Market derived its income from sales commission rather than rental charges on stalls, the issue of rental adjustment did not arise. Rental charges at Poultry Market had also been determined with reference to the cost recovery principle in its early years. In the light of the temporary nature of Poultry Market, and the fact that it had been in use for over 20 years, its rental was determined with reference to the Consumer Price Index (A) starting from 1998-1999.
- 5. As for the Cheung Sha Wan and Western Wholesale Food Markets, SFH pointed out that these two Markets had always determined their rentals with reference to the cost recovery principle since 1994. Costing review was conducted biennially. He explained that as the costing review in 2008 showed that the management costs for the Cheung Sha Wan and Western Wholesale Food Markets had increased, particularly in respect of the hiring of cleansing and security services, AFCD had concluded that rentals at the two Markets should increase by 11.42% to tie in with the rise in management costs. SFH further said that 68% of the tenants would be facing an actual increase of less than \$800. In response to tenants' comments, the costing review had excluded costs for implementing measures relevant to improving public order and public health (including implementing the Market Entry Registration System, crow control, and enhance inspection of imported freshwater fish).
