Implementation of the Mandatory Provident Fund System Progress Report – April 2012

Purpose

This paper is the monthly update on the implementation of the Mandatory Provident Fund (MPF) System.

Enrolment

2. The estimated enrolment statistics are as follows:

3. The enrolment rates of employees, employers and SEPs remained stable. As at the end of April 2012, 18 600 employers, 405 700 employees and 18 200 SEPs were registered under the Industry Schemes¹.

Complaint Handling

<u>Complaints received by the Mandatory Provident Fund Schemes Authority</u> (MPFA) on system operation

4. In April 2012, 325 complaints were received by the MPFA, of which 300 complaints were made against 241 employers. The nature of the complaints received was as follows:

Complaints received by the Labour Department ("LD")

- 5. In April 2012, the LD received 11 MPF-related complaint cases. They were all related to alleged wrongful deduction of wages and default contribution.
- 6. Of the 57 complaint cases received from 1 January 2012 to 30 April 2012:
 - 12 cases were resolved after conciliation or advice given;
 - 19 cases were referred to the Labour Tribunal/Minor Employment Claims Adjudication Board for adjudication;
 - 3 cases where the employers were insolvent were referred to the Legal Aid Department, the Official Receiver's Office and the Protection of Wages on Insolvency Fund; and
 - 23 cases where the employees had lodged claims with the LD were awaiting conciliation result.

Enforcement

7. The MPFA continued to enforce the Mandatory Provident Fund Schemes Ordinance by investigating complaints, inspecting employment premises, making claims at law courts on behalf of employees to recover outstanding default contributions, and prosecuting non-compliant employers.

Education and Publicity

- 9. During the month, the MPF Investment Education Campaign continued to equip scheme members with the basic knowledge for making informed decisions in their lifelong MPF investment journey. The publicity of the comic strip series engaging a popular local comic character "Maggiology" (「馬仔」) continued. Digital posters of the comic strips were shown on a screen in Mong Kok Post Office to publicize investment education messages.
- 10. A new issue of the *Summary of Fee Comparative Platform on MPF Funds*, a quarterly publication, was produced to provide simplified fee information on MPF funds for scheme members who do not have convenient access to Internet.
- 11. With a view to reminding employers of the importance of compliance with MPF obligations under the law, the MPFA issued letters to all employers in April to urge them to make MPF contributions on time, provide employees with pay-records within seven working days after contributions were made and notify trustees after an employee has ceased employment, and draw their attention to the financial penalty that may be imposed on offenders.
- 12. For youth education, a prize presentation ceremony was held on 18 April to wrap up the Multimedia Competition on MPF for Students of Tertiary Institutions (「積金 MAX 創意」大專多媒體創作大賽). The winning entries were posted on online social media for further dissemination of MPF messages. In addition, school-based Other Learning Experience activities under the New Senior Secondary Curriculum were organized in two secondary schools.
- 13. To reach out to members of the community and to educate them on MPF investment, an outreaching activity was carried out and 11 MPF talks were conducted for civil servants, employers, employees, students and the community.
- During the month, finance reporters were briefed on the details of the Employee Choice Arrangement and the benefits transfer process. In addition, 14 press releases were issued. Apart from the press releases on enforcement actions, one press release introduced a new TV game show entitled *MPF Kaleidoscope* which would be telecast on TVB-Jade on five consecutive Wednesday nights in May, and another on the results of MPFA's multimedia competition for tertiary students. Moreover, 22 articles contributed by the MPFA on various aspects of the MPF System and MPF investment were carried in different publications.
