- 5. <u>Ms Starry LEE</u> declared that she owned properties along the alignment of the Shatin to Central Link (SCL).
- 6. <u>The Administration</u> and <u>MTR Corporation Limited (MTRCL)</u> briefed members on the progress of the SCL scheme. <u>The Administration</u> proposed to consult the Subcommittee on the funding proposal of the SCL project on 23 March 2012 at 8:30 am. <u>The Subcommittee</u> agreed.
- Admin/ 7. At the request of the Subcommittee, the Administration/MTRCL agreed to provide supplementary information on the following
  - (a) the updated position on the provision of Park & Ride facilities and an explanation of why such facilities could not be made available at the six interchange stations;
  - (b) response to a request for provision of facilities allowing passengers to receive radio broadcasting at SCL stations and the cost implications of providing such facilities;
  - (c) the cultural and art programmes planned for SCL stations;
  - (d) assessment of the impact of the increase in passenger volume after the commissioning of SCL on the existing railway network;
  - (e) the provision of public transport interchange at the Tai Wai station to meet the needs of interchange passengers after the commissioning of SCL;
  - (f) timetable of the reprovisioning works for the implementation of the SCL project; and

(g) numbers of trees to be felled in different districts due to the SCL construction works.

8. <u>Subcommittee members</u> noted that the MTRCL had considered and decided not to adopt a suggestion made by members at the last meeting that the MTRCL should retrofit the APGs along the Ma On Shan Line (MOL) first and reprovision the APGs when the construction of SCL began on the following grounds –

(a) when the SCL came into operation, platform modifications would be required for the MOL;

Action

- (b) if the retrofitting of APGs along the MOL was carried out first, most of the APGs installed would have to be dismantled when construction of the SCL began, as the train door opening positions for 4-car trains would be different from the positions for 8-car trains operating on the extended platform;
- (c) the dismantling process would inevitably cause damage to the APGs, rendering them unfit for installation again, resulting in wastage; and
- (d) dismantling and reinstallation of the APGs along the MOL would also delay completion of the whole retrofitting project.

Therefore, the MTRCL maintained that the APG retrofitting works along MOL should be carried out in tandem with the SCL project.

9. <u>Subcommittee members</u> in general expressed strong dissatisfaction with the long lead time to retrofit APGs along the East Rail Line (EAL)/MOL. <u>Mr Andrew CHENG</u> criticized the MTRCL for failing to provide detailed information on the estimated cost that would be incurred by adopting the above suggestion made by members.

### MTRCL 10. <u>The Subcommittee</u> urged the MTRCL to –

- (a) introduce additional safety measures from the present onwards until completion of the retrofitting project to prevent passengers from falling onto the rail track; and
- (b) employ additional Platform Assistants, especially for crowded stations such as Kowloon Tong Station, to maintain platform order and provide assistance to passengers to board and alight at EAL and MOL stations.
