INTRODUCTION

Section 29A of the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance (Cap. 1) empowers the Financial Secretary (which means also the Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury by virtue of section 3 of Cap. 1) to vary fees which are specified by subsidiary legislation made by the Chief Executive in Council. Section 46(2) of the Firearms and Ammunition Ordinance (Cap. 238) also empowers the Financial Secretary to prescribe from time to time by order in the Gazette the storage fees for arms, ammunition or imitation firearms stored by the Commissioner of Police.

- 2. In exercise of these powers, the Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury has made the Amendment Regulations and Amendment Order, as set out at *Annexes A to E*, to revise the fees specified in the following subsidiary legislation:
 - (a) Dutiable Commodities Regulations made under the Dutiable Commodities Ordinance (the relevant Amendment Regulation at *Annex A*);

- (b) Firearms and Ammunition Regulations and Firearms and Ammunition (Storage Fees) Order, both made under the Firearms and Ammunition Ordinance (the relevant Amendment Regulation and Amendment Order at *Annexes B and C* respectively);
- (c) Pawnbrokers Regulations made under the Pawnbrokers Ordinance (the relevant Amendment Regulation at *Annex D*); and
- (d) Massage Establishments Regulations made under the Massage Establishments Ordinance (the relevant Amendment Regulation at *Annex E*).

BACKGROUND AND JUSTIFICATIONS

- 3. The fee for the issue of a temporary liquor licence is prescribed in the Dutiable Commodities Regulations (Cap. 109 sub. leg. A). The fees payable relating to various licences (and an exemption) in relation to firearms and ammunition are prescribed in the Firearms and Ammunition Regulations (Cap. 238 sub. leg. A). The storage fees for arms, ammunition and imitation firearms are prescribed in the Firearms and Ammunition (Storage Fees) Order (Cap. 238 sub. leg. B). The fee for the grant or renewal of a pawnbroker licence is prescribed in the Pawnbrokers Regulations (Cap. 166 sub. leg. A). The fees payable for the issue or renewal of a massage establishment licence are prescribed in the Massage Establishments Regulations (Cap. 266 sub. leg. A).
- 4. It is the Government's established policy that fees for services charged by the Government should be set at levels adequate to recover the full cost of providing the goods or services. The latest costing review at 2012-13 prices shows that the fees payable under the afore-mentioned Regulations and Order are not adequate to recover the full cost of providing the services. Details of the cost computations are set out at **Annex F**.
- 5. To alleviate the impact of the fee increases on the users of the services concerned, we propose to increase the fees by 10% to 21%, with a view to achieving full-cost recovery within one to seven years in accordance with the Government-wide general guidelines for the increases. Details of the existing and proposed fees are set out at **Annex G**.

THE REGULATIONS/ORDER

6. The Amendment Regulations and the Amendment Order revise the fees set out at *Annex G*. We propose that the new fees should come into effect on 22 June 2012.

EFFICIENCY INITIATIVES

7. The Hong Kong Police Force regularly reviews the arrangements for handling applications for various licensing activities under its purview with a view to improving efficiency and effectiveness. The Force has put the application forms for pawnbrokers licence, temporary liquor licence, massage establishment licence, and the arms licences and permits, together with comprehensive guidance notes on the application procedures, onto the Government website for applicants to download directly. Since 2010, the application forms for the arms licences and permits have been fine-tuned to streamline the work procedures.

BASIC LAW AND HUMAN RIGHTS IMPLICATIONS

8. The proposal is in conformity with the Basic Law, including the provisions concerning human rights.

BINDING EFFECT OF THE LEGISLATION

9. The Amendment Regulations and the Amendment Order do not affect the binding effect of the respective principal Ordinances, and Regulations and Order referred to in paragraph 2 above.

FINANCIAL AND STAFFING IMPLICATIONS

10. Additional revenue to be generated from the proposed fee revision is estimated to be about \$0.6 million a year. There are no staffing implications.

ECONOMIC IMPLICATIONS

11. The fee adjustments are small in dollar terms and are unlikely to have material impact on the operating costs of the businesses concerned. The overall economic impact is expected to be insignificant.

PUBLIC CONSULTATION

12. We issued a paper explaining the revision proposals for these and other fees to the Panel on Security of the Legislative Council on 23 March 2012. The Panel did not ask to discuss the proposed revision, and no views have been received from Members of the Panel.

PUBLICITY

13. The Amendment Regulations and the Amendment Order will be published in the Gazette on 27 April 2012. A spokesperson will be available to answer any enquiries on this subject.
