I. Election of Chairman

2. The Bills Committee deliberated (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).

- 3. <u>Members</u> requested the Administration -
 - (a) to provide a written response to the issues raised in the letter dated 5 September 2013 from the Assistant Legal Adviser to the Administration;
 - (b) to advise on the support and assistance available to a child who had been abducted to the Mainland, Taiwan or any jurisdiction which was not a contracting state to the Convention on the Civil Aspects of International Child Abduction which was signed at The Hague on 25 October 1980;
 - (c) to provide information on the status and implementation in the Mainland and Taiwan of court orders issued in Hong Kong in relation to the Child Abduction and Custody Ordinance (Cap. 512);
 - (d) to explain how law enforcement agencies would determine whether a child who was leaving Hong Kong alone was being abducted within the meaning of the Bill or not; and
 - (e) to consider spelling out expressly in the Bill the definition of a child, including whether it included a child born in wedlock, a child born out of wedlock, an adopted child and whether it covered a person under the age of 16 or 18.

Action

4. <u>Members</u> agreed to invite public views on the Bill by posting a notice on the Legislative Council website and issuing invitation letters to all District Councils. <u>Members</u> also agreed to receive the views of the public at the next meeting.

III. Dates of subsequent meetings

5. <u>Members</u> agreed that the Clerk would schedule the next two meetings in consultation with the Chairman.

(*Post-meeting note*: With the concurrence of the Chairman, a meeting was scheduled for 6 December 2013 at 10:45 am to receive the views of the public on the Bill and a meeting was scheduled for 17 December 2013 at 10:45 am to continue discussion with the Administration.)
