Speech by the Secretary for Home Affairs in the Legislative Council on 22 May 2013

Resolution under section 7(a) of the Legal Aid Ordinance (Cap. 91) Financial Eligibility Limits of the Legal Aid Applicants

President,

I move the Resolution standing in my name on the agenda.

In accordance with sections 5 and 5A of the Legal Aid Ordinance, a person whose disposable financial resources do not exceed \$260,000 is financially eligible for legal aid under the Ordinary Legal Aid Scheme. The corresponding limit for the Supplementary Legal Aid Scheme is \$1,300,000. The above-mentioned limit for the Ordinary Scheme also applies to criminal legal aid. The Administration reviews the limits annually to take into account movements in consumer prices, so as to maintain the real value of the limits.

We have recently completed the 2012 annual review. The increase in Consumer Price Index (C) between July 2011 and July 2012 is 3.7%. We now propose the Resolution to adjust upward the limit for the Ordinary Scheme from \$260,000 to \$269,620, and from \$1,300,000 to \$1,348,100 for the Supplementary Scheme.

I invite Members to support the Resolution.
