I. Meeting with the Administration and representatives of the Hong Kong Bar Association and The Law Society of Hong Kong

The Chairman said that he received a letter dated 5 November 2012 from Mr Alan LEONG informing his withdrawal from the Subcommittee.

- 2. <u>The Subcommittee</u> deliberated (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).
- 3. <u>Members</u> shared the views of the two legal professional bodies that the rates of final contribution for Type II proceedings under the Supplementary Legal Aid Scheme ("SLAS") (i.e. the new types of civil proceedings apart from those relating to Labour Tribunal appeals and existing types of civil proceedings for professional negligence claims) at 20% or 15% where a claim was settled prior to the commencement of the trial or delivery of a brief for attendance to counsel were too high, having regard to the fact that the rates of final contribution under the existing SLAS were 10% and 6%.

- 4. At the request of members, <u>the Administration</u> agreed to review the final contribution rates for Type II proceedings under the SLAS and adjust the rates, where appropriate, in light of operational experience. <u>The Administration</u> added that it did not rule out reducing the rates, as had been done in the past, if the Supplementary Legal Aid Fund could be maintained at a level sufficient to provide legal services to people who were financially in need.
- 5. <u>Members</u> were of the view that the scope of the SLAS should be further expanded to cover more new types of cases, such as but not limited to class actions, as set out in the submission of the Hong Kong Bar Association. <u>Members</u> agreed to refer the issues raised to the Panel on Administration of Justice and Legal Services for follow up.

II. Any other business

- 6. <u>The Subcommittee</u> supported the two Amendment Regulations and the Commencement Notice. A written report on the deliberations of the Subcommittee would be submitted for the meeting of the House Committee on 16 November 2012.
- 7. There being no other business, the meeting ended at 9:25 am.
