**List of follow-up actions arising from the discussion
at the meeting on 31 May 2013**

At the meeting on 31 May 2013, the Administration was requested to provide the following information on the households selected for interview in "The Study of Health Effects of Transportation Noise in Hong Kong" conducted by The Chinese University of Hong Kong and commissioned by the Environmental Protection Department for members' reference –

- (a) the characteristics of the living environment of the sampled households (e.g. types of living quarters (public/private), floor levels of living quarters, household size, districts of residence, levels of noise exposure at the place of residence (high/medium/low), etc);
- (b) the demographic features of the respondents of the sampled households (e.g. gender, age, education attainment, occupation, etc); and
- (c) the physical and mental health status of the respondents of the sampled households.

2. The Administration was also requested to provide information on the enforcement of the Noise Control Ordinance (Cap. 400) and other pieces of legislation in exercising control over the noise level of traditional cultural activities such as lion dance which could be noisy and could cause noise disturbance to nearby residents, while catering to the need of such activities for practices, etc.
