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- 1) The EDB has been working closely with the HKEAA to continuously review and enhance the special examination arrangements (SEAs) so that candidates with special educational needs (SEN) can be equitably assessed under suitable conditions without having an unfair advantage over other candidates. According to the results statistics of the 2012 and 2013 Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education Examinations, SEN candidates performed less well in Liberal Studies (LS) than non-SEN candidates. Generally speaking, candidates' performance in public examinations may be affected by various factors (such as psychological and mental conditions) which may cause disparity in performance. For SEN students, the learning process and effectiveness of classroom teaching will also have a direct impact on their public examination results. The HKEAA strives to provide fair and valid assessments to all candidates. However, the public examinations are summative assessments which measure and reflect the learning outcomes of students. The reasons for their relatively poor performance need to be examined from the teaching and learning perspectives. As such, the EDB should conduct an indepth study on this issue with schools.
- 2) The number of students with special educational needs ("SEN") taking Chinese Language, English Language and Mathematics in the Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education ("HKDSE") Examination and their performance in comparison with non-SEN students in the HKDSE Examination of 2012 and 2013 are summarized in the following tables.
