(A) Items scheduled for discussion at Panel meetings

1. Provision of international school places and facilitation measures

The subject was last discussed on 13 February 2012. Members are concerned about the supply of international school places and the availability of sites for building school premises. The Administration will report to the Panel the findings of the study on the supply and demand of international school places in Hong Kong, and to brief the Panel on the facilitation measures to be implemented in response to the findings of the study.

2. Review on the subvention arrangements for the English Schools Foundation ("ESF")

In June 2012, the Administration provided information on the progress of the review on the subvention arrangements for ESF [LC Paper No. CB(2)2332/11-12(01)]. According to the Administration, discussion with ESF was on-going and the Administration will report the progress of the review to the Panel.

5. Grievance procedures of the University Grants Committee ("UGC")-funded institutions

At the meeting on 12 July 2010, UGC briefed members on the guidelines of best practices in redress mechanisms developed by UGC having regard to the findings of the research on grievance procedures of 10 reputable overseas institutions and the responses of local institutions to these best practices. Members requested UGC to provide updated complaint/grievance handling flow charts of individual institutions and the institutions' responses to the UGC's recommendations for the Panel to follow up.

The research report entitled "Complaint handling mechanism in higher education sector in selected places" prepared by the Research Division of the Legislative Council Secretariat was circulated to members on 13 October 2010 vide LC Paper No. CB(2)32/10-11.

UGC provided an update of the UGC-funded institutions' response to the UGC's recommendations on the grievance/complaint handling procedures and the updated grievances/complaint handling flow charts of individual institutions, which was circulated to members vide LC Paper No. CB(2)2407/10-11(01) on 18 July 2011.

6. Implementation of education support measures for non-Chinese speaking students

At the meeting on 16 October 2012, members suggested that the Administration should be requested to update the Panel on the progress of the implementation of education support measures for non-Chinese speaking (NCS)

8. The subject of Liberal Studies in New Senior Secondary curriculum

At the meeting on 14 January 2013, Dr Hon Priscilla LEUNG suggested that the Panel should discuss matters related to Liberal Studies in New Senior Secondary ("NSS") curriculum. Issues of concern include whether the subject should be a mandatory subject in NSS curriculum and for fulfillment of the general entrance requirement for local undergraduate programmes, the curriculum design and course contents, the impact on teachers etc.

9. Issues relating to the relocation of the centres of the Christian Zheng Sheng Association and development of rehabilitation centre-cum-schools

At the meeting on 12 July 2010, members agreed that the Panel should discuss the matter depending on the progress of the Administration's discussion with Christian Zheng Sheng Association ("CZSA").

At the meeting on 14 February 2011, the Panel passed a motion requesting the Administration to solve in the near future the problem concerning the relocation of the drug treatment and rehabilitation centres of CZSA. In its written response to the motion which was circulated to members vide LC Paper No. CB(2)1413/10-11(01) on 31 March 2011, the Administration advised that the Security Bureau was taking the lead in coordinating matters relating to the relocation of the drug treatment and rehabilitation centers of CZSA. The Administration also provided in its response a brief update on the Christian Zheng Sheng College's application for operating New Senior Secondary courses at its existing school premises in Ha Keng. In late April 2011, the Administration provided further information on the latest development of the matter (LC Paper Nos. CB(2)1636/10-11(01) and (02)).
