2013 Tariff: Key Changes

We share the community's concern for environmental improvement and a reliable supply of electricity at a reasonable cost

Key Changes

- Average Basic Tariff unchanged
- CLP managing impact of rising fuel costs Fuel Clause Charge increase contained at 4.6 ¢/kWh
- New initiatives to help customers save energy
 - New Energy Saving Rebate to help low consumption customers
 - 6th block added to the Domestic Tariff Structure for high consumption customers
- 2013 Rent and Rates Special Rebate of 2.1 ¢/kWh

New Energy Saving Rebate

Total consumption per bill	Rebate level
200 kWh or below	9 ¢/kWh
201 to 300 kWh	8 ¢/kWh
301 to 400 kWh	7 ¢/kWh

Depending on their consumption, we estimate that

- •Some 35% or 700,000 of our domestic customers and
- •Some 44% or 130,000 of our small business customers will see no increase or will enjoy savings in their electricity bills

We will also introduce a 6th Block to our Domestic Tariff

•For less than 1% of our domestic customers who use more than 5x the average consumption.





Rent & Rates Special Rebate

- Rebate of 3.3 ¢/kWh offered in 2012
- Rebated over HK\$1 billion so far
- In anticipation of reimbursement by Government, a 2.1 ¢/kWh
 Special Rebate will be provided in 2013
- We estimate that, by the end of 2013, this rebate will complete the return to CLP's customers of all of the overcharged Rent & Rates money refunded by Government




Basic Tariff still below 1997 but rising fuel cost driving increases


Highly volatile fuel prices rising much faster than local inflation







Gas Price Trend






Fuel Costs in 2013 Continue to Rise Sharply










