Genetically Modified Food Found Locally

The table below summarised the genetically modified (GM) events that have either been detected by the Government Laboratory or been reported in previous studies conducted by Consumer Council or the Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation Department (AFCD). Please note that some of the events were detected at low levels, which was probably due to adventitious mixing of GM and non-GM crops during harvest, transportation, processing and storage.

[#] These varieties of papaya were found to be imported and/or planted in Hong Kong by the AFCD. In Hong Kong, papaya is widely cultivated for its fruits. While a few organic farmers grow small quantities of organic papaya for the local market, many villagers and subsistence farmers also grow papaya trees in their backyards or in small plantings on farmlands for their own consumption and sell modest surpluses in local markets.
