PLACES OF PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENT (LICENCES) (FEES) REGULATION

INTRODUCTION

Pursuant to sections 124J and 124L of the Public Health and Municipal Services Ordinance (Cap. 132) (“PHMSO”) and section 7 of the Places of Public Entertainment Ordinance (Cap. 172) (“PPEO”), the Secretary for Home Affairs (“SHA”) has made the following three regulations to align the fees and charges of the municipal facilities and services under his policy purview -

- (a) the Public Health and Municipal Services (Fees and Charges) (Leisure Facilities) (Amendment) Regulation 2013 (“Amendment Regulation”) at **Annex A** to provide for fees and charges payable by an individual as a member of the public in connection with the matters specified in Schedule 16 to the PHMSO, i.e., the fees for the use of eight types of sports and leisure facilities, namely, public swimming pools, public pleasure grounds (including tennis courts, basketball courts, badminton courts, table tennis tables, squash courts and football pitches) and camp fees for holiday camps;
- (b) the Public Health and Municipal Services (Fees and Charges) (Places of Amusement Licences) Regulation (“PAL Regulation”) at **Annex B** to provide for the fees and charges payable in connection with the licensing of the activities specified in the

Eleventh Schedule to PHMSO, i.e., billiard establishments, public bowling-alleys and public skating rinks; and

- (c) the Places of Public Entertainment (Licences) (Fees) Regulation (“PPEL Regulation”) at **Annex C** to provide for fees payable in respect of any licence that the licensing authority concerned is empowered to issue under the PPEO.

BACKGROUND

2. The existing levels of fees and charges for most of the leisure facilities and services under the management of the Leisure and Cultural Services Department (“LCSD”), and for the Places of Public Entertainment (“PPE”) licences issued by the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department were inherited from the two former Municipal Councils. There are different fee levels for the same types of municipal facilities and services in the urban area and New Territories. In his 2013 Policy Address, the Chief Executive (“CE”) announced that the Administration would amend the legislation to align the fees and charges for the same types of municipal facilities and services in the urban area and the New Territories based on the lower of the two levels. We consulted the Legislative Council Panel on Home Affairs (“LegCo HA Panel”) on our fee alignment proposals on 15 April 2013. Details can be found in LC Paper No. CB(2)936/12-13(05).

PROPOSAL

The Amendment Regulation

3. Schedule 16 to the PHMSO sets out the matters where SHA may by regulation provide for their fees and charges. Such matters include admission fees for public swimming pools, hiring charges for tennis courts, basketball courts, squash courts, football pitches, table-tennis tables and badminton courts, and camp fees for holiday camps, involving about 130 items of fees and charges. The existing and proposed levels of fee and charges for the relevant leisure facilities are set out in **Annex D**. The proposed fee levels in respect of these items are prescribed in the Amendment Regulation. We propose to align these fee items according to the following principles:

- (a) where the fee or charge for a leisure facility or service differs between the urban area and the New Territories, the lower rate will prevail; and
- (b) to introduce non-peak hour rates to facilities in the urban area by making reference to the charging mode in the New Territories.

4. In addition, there are about 850 items of fees and charges applicable to leisure facilities and programmes that may be revised by LCSD under its delegated authority. Examples include fees and charges in respect of recreation and sports programmes, and facilities at water sports centres, bowling greens and golf facilities. Upon completion of the current legislative exercise, LCSD will align the remaining fee items based on the principles set out in paragraph 3 above.

The PAL Regulation

5. The Eleventh Schedule to the PHMSO sets out the activities where SHA may by regulation provide for fees payable for the grant and renewal of licences in respect of these activities and the issue of a duplicate or amendment to a licence. Such activities include billiard establishments, public bowling-alleys and public skating rinks. We propose to align the licence fees in the urban area and New Territories based on the lower of the two levels. The existing and proposed fee levels for places of amusement licences are set out in **Annex E**.

The PPEL Regulation

6. Section 7(1)(ba) of the PPEO provides that the SHA may by regulation provide for fees payable in respect of the relevant licences, including fees for the issue, renewal or amendment of a licence or duplicate licence. We propose to align the PPE licence fees in the urban area and New Territories based on the lower of the two levels. The existing and proposed fee levels for PPE licences are set out at **Annex F**.

OTHER OPTIONS

7. There is no alternative option as the fee alignment proposal has to be implemented by legislative means as required by the ordinances concerned.

THE REGULATIONS

PUBLIC HEALTH AND MUNICIPAL SERVICES (FEES AND CHARGES) (LEISURE FACILITIES) (AMENDMENT) REGULATION 2013

8. The main provisions of the Amendment Regulation are as follows -
- (a) section 1 stipulates that the regulation comes into operation on 1 August 2013. Members of the public will pay the new fees when using leisure facilities on or after 1 August 2013. For applicants who make advance bookings to use the facilities on or after 1 August 2013, the new fees will also apply. As LCSD needs time to adjust the setting of the fees and charges in the computerised Leisure Link booking system, and to conduct testing, 1 August 2013 is the earliest date when the fee alignment can be implemented; and
 - (b) section 4 substitutes a new section 3 in the Public Health and Municipal Services (Fees and Charges)(Leisure Facilities) Regulation (Cap. 132CN). The new section 3 provides that the fees payable in connection with admission to public swimming pools, hiring of facilities at public pleasure grounds and camp fees for holiday camps during different time periods are set out in Schedules 1 to 3 to the Regulation.

PUBLIC HEALTH AND MUNICIPAL SERVICES (FEES AND CHARGES) (PLACES OF AMUSEMENT LICENCES) REGULATION

9. The main provisions of the PAL Regulation are outlined below:
- (a) section 1 stipulates that the regulation comes into operation on 19 July 2013, which is after the expiry of the 28+21 days period for negative vetting. For licences that are renewed on or after 19 July 2013, the new aligned fees will be applicable to the licence holders when their renewed licences are being issued. We will collect the new licence fees from 19 July 2013 onwards. For licences that are renewed before 19 July 2013, the licence holders will pay the existing fees for renewal of licences; and
 - (b) section 2 provides that the fees for grant or renewal of a licence for places of amusement, and the issue of a duplicate of or amendment to a licence, are set out in the Schedule.

PLACES OF PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENT (LICENCES) (FEES) REGULATION

10. The main provisions of the PPEL Regulation are outlined below:
- (a) section 1 stipulates that the regulation comes into operation on 19 July 2013. Same as the places of amusement licences, new fees will be applicable to those PPE licences that are granted or renewed on or after 19 July 2013. For licences that are renewed before 19 July 2013, the licence holders will pay the existing fees for renewal of licences; and
 - (b) section 2 provides that the fees for grant or renewal of a PPE licence, and the issue of a duplicate of or amendment to a licence, are set out in the Schedule.

IMPLICATIONS OF THE PROPOSAL

12. With the alignment of some 150 items of fees and charges based on the principles set out in paragraph 3 above, we estimate that about 7 million users will benefit and that the revenue foregone will be about \$20 million. The proposal is in conformity with the Basic Law, including the provisions concerning human rights. The proposal will not affect the binding effect of the existing provisions of the PHMSO, PPEO and the existing regulations under these Ordinances.

PUBLIC CONSULTATION

13. We consulted the Community Sports Committee of the Sports Commission and the Chairmen and Vice-chairmen of the District Councils in March 2013 on the proposals to align the fees and charges for sports and leisure facilities. All those consulted supported the proposal. We briefed the LegCo HA Panel on the fee alignment proposal at its meeting on 15 April 2013. Members generally supported the proposal.

PUBLICITY

14. We issued a press release on the fee alignment proposals on 22 May 2013 to tie in with the gazettal of the Regulations. Upon completion of the legislative process, we will publicise the new fees and charges for leisure facilities and services, and PAL and PPE licences, through press releases and the websites of the relevant bureaux and departments.
