<u>The Administration</u> briefed members on the papers which set out the Administration's response to the issues raised by members at the meeting on 5 November 2013 and the submission from the Hong Kong Workers' Health Centre.

# Follow-up actions required of the Administration

- Admin 3. To facilitate further discussion on the Bill, the Administration was requested to
  - (a) provide information on public sector buildings (including their fixtures) which were built of materials consisting of asbestos-containing material, and the policy considerations regarding whether to publish the information;
  - (b) advise, in relation to considerations that were listed in paragraph 6(e) of the Administration's paper (LC Paper No. CB(1)330/13-14(02)) –

- (i) whether the Administration would consider specifying those considerations in the Bill;
- (ii) whether the considerations could be found in any internal guidelines of the Environmental Protection Department, if so, to provide the relevant guidelines; and
- (iii) further to 3(b)(ii) above, whether the Administration would consider publishing the relevant guidelines, if any;
- (c) clarify, in the light of the Administration's response that if the Bill was passed, applications made under section 14 of the Air Pollution Control Ordinance (Cap. 311) ("APCO") for works specified in item 19 of Schedule 1 to the APCO would be refused,
  - (i) whether the relevant authority still had any discretion to grant a licence under section 15(3) of the APCO for any of the works specified in the item after the Bill came into operation;
  - (ii) if the answer to 3(c)(i) above was in the affirmative, the legal basis for the relevant authority to grant a licence given sections 80 to 83; and
  - (iii) if the answer to 3(c)(i) above was negative, whether item 19 should be repealed consequentially and if not, whether this would create the legitimate expectation of an applicant that a discretion still existed; and
- (d) clarify, in relation to asbestos that were regulated under a permit system under the Hazardous Chemicals Control Ordinance (Cap 595)("HCCO") and section 10(3) of HCCO whether, in the light of the response to the questions in 3(c) above, consequential amendments are necessary for similar reasons.

### Dates of future meetings

- 4. <u>Members</u> noted that the next meeting was scheduled for 2 December 2013 to meet with deputations and the Administration. <u>Members</u> agreed to schedule a further meeting on 17 December 2013 to examine the Bill.
- 5. <u>The Chairman</u> said that he would be out of town on 2 December 2013 to attend to urgent matters, and that invitations were already sent to various organizations and the public to give views on the Bill. As such, he proposed

to keep the date of the next meeting and invite members present at the next meeting to elect a Chairman amongst themselves to act in his absence and chair the meeting according to paragraph 4.2 of the Handbook for Chairmen for Bills Committee. <u>Members</u> agreed.
