#### **Meeting with the Administration** I.

The Bills Committee deliberated (index of proceedings attached at Annex).

- 2. <u>Members</u> requested the Administration -
  - (a) to reconsider, for the purpose of consistency in the use of expressions in the Employment Ordinance ("EO") (Cap. 57), amending all other provisions relating to calculation of "daily average of the wages" in respect of other relevant statutory entitlements under EO to align with the proposed amendments in the Bill; and
  - (b) to review the description of the long title of the Bill, taking into account members' views.
- 3. The Administration agreed to provide The Law Society of Hong Kong with the Administration's response to the issues raised in its submission, and undertook to include examples setting out the mode in which the paternity leave ("PL") entitled by an employee could be taken in its guidelines to be issued on PL after enactment of the Bill.
