I. Meeting with the Administration

Committee Stage amendments to the Bill proposed by the Administration

2. <u>The Bills Committee</u> completed scrutiny of the draft Committee Stage amendments ("CSAs") to the Bill to be proposed by the Administration, and did not raise objection to the proposed amendments.

<u>Legislative timetable</u>

- 3. <u>The Bills Committee</u> noted the Administration's intention to resume the Second Reading debate on the Bill at the Council meeting of 21 January 2015 and no members raised objection. <u>Members</u> noted that the deadline for giving notice of moving CSAs to the Bill, if any, was 12 January 2015.
- 4. <u>Members</u> agreed that the Bills Committee would report its deliberations to the House Committee at its meeting on 9 January 2015.

Commencement of the Bill

5. <u>Members</u> noted that apart from the proposed amendments to section 27 of the Pharmacy and Poisons Ordinance (Cap. 138) and regulation 15 of the Pharmacy and Poisons Regulations (Cap. 138A), the Administration's intention was to appoint, by notice in the Gazette, 30 January 2015 as the commencement date of the rest of the provisions of the Bill, if passed. The notice would be a subsidiary legislation subject to negative vetting of the Legislative Council.
