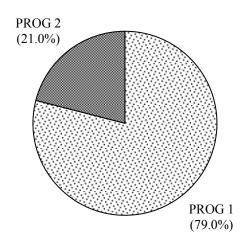

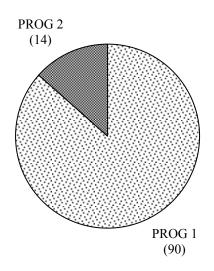

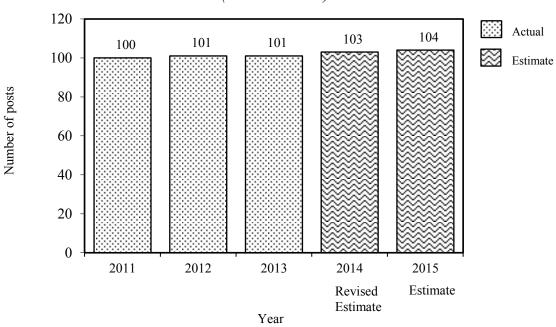
Allocation of provision to programmes (2014-15)

The estimate of the amount required in 2014–15 for the salaries and expenses of the Chief Executive's Office is \$99,112,000. This represents an increase of \$3,765,000 over the revised estimate for 2013–14 and of \$6,724,000 over actual expenditure in 2012–13.

- **2** Provision of \$99,112,000 under *Subhead 000 Operational expenses* is for the salaries, allowances and other operating expenses of the Chief Executive's Office. This includes provision of \$834,200 for a non-accountable entertainment allowance for the Chief Executive.
- 3 The establishment as at 31 March 2014 will be 103 permanent posts. It is expected that there will be an increase of one non-directorate permanent post in 2014–15. Subject to certain conditions, the controlling officer may under delegated power create or delete non-directorate posts during 2014–15, but the notional annual mid-point salary value of all such posts must not exceed \$39,404,000.
