<u>The Chairman</u> reminded the deputations that their written submissions provided to the Subcommittee and views presented at the meeting would not be covered by the protection and immunity provided under the Legislative Council (Powers and Privileges) Ordinance (Cap. 382).

2. <u>The Subcommittee</u> deliberated (Index of proceedings attached at **Appendix**).

3. <u>The Subcommittee</u> received views from 14 deputations/individuals attending the meeting, and noted 13 written submissions from other organizations/individuals which/who did not attend the meeting.

4. The views of the deputations were summarized as follows –

(a) The mandatory requirement for new applicants of public light bus ("PLB") driving licence to take pre-service course before they were issued PLB driving licences would exacerbate the difficulties of the PLB industry in recruiting PLB drivers, and therefore PLB operators preferred that the commencement date of the requirement be deferred; and

- (b) The Administration should provide assistance to the PLB industry in coping with the impact of introducing the requirement for taking pre-service course, such as the provision of subsidies for drivers.
- 5. <u>The Administration</u> was requested to take the following actions
  - (a) to consider the postponement of the date on which Part 4 of the Road Traffic (Amendment) Ordinance 2012 in relation to the pre-service course requirement comes into operation (currently set to be 1 June 2015);
  - (b) to provide a summary of the concerns raised by deputations at the meeting and the Administration's response;
  - (c) to provide supplementary information explaining the difficulties which the Administration has encountered when proposing to District Councils or local communities to relax the restricted zones for passengers pick-up/drop off; and
  - (d) to provide further analysis, from the statistics of traffic accidents involving public light buses from 2009 to 2013, on whether Green Mini-buses or Red Mini-buses are more prone to traffic accidents.

6. <u>Members</u> agreed that a meeting should be conducted at 10:45 am on 7 October 2014 to follow up on the Administration's response to deputations and the Subcommittee in relation to the Road Traffic (Amendment) Ordinance 2012 (Commencement) Notice ("the Notice") and that the Chairman would move a motion at the Council meeting of 15 October 2014 to extend the scrutiny period of the Notice to the Council meeting of 5 November 2014.

The provision of subsidies for course takers would be contrary to the "User Pays" principle that the Government had all along adhered to in the provision of this type of services to the public. In any case, eligible course-takers could already apply for full or 70% waiver of the course fee.	
		Mr YICK Chi-ming questioned whether the commencement date promulgated by the Administration was appropriate. He urged the Administration to review the employment situation of the PLB industry.	
		Mr YICK noted from the deputations that the PLB trade could not attract and retain drivers because the remuneration was low compared to other professional drivers. He urged the Administration to implement measures to improve the operating environment of the PLB trade.	
		The Administration replied that measures had been taken by TD to assist the PLB trade, e.g. to improve the operating efficiency through reorganization of
