#### I. Meeting with the Administration

[LC Paper Nos. CB(2)165/14-15(01), CB(2)165/14-15(02), CB(2)2070/13-14(06), CB(2)2345/13-14(01), CB(2)96/14-15(02) and L.N. 90 of 2014]

1. <u>The Subcommittee</u> deliberated (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).

#### Follow-up actions required of the Administration

- 2. <u>Members</u> noted that the motion to extend the scrutiny period was not dealt with at the Council meeting of 22 October 2014 due to heavy agenda of the Council meeting, and the period for amending the Food and Drugs (Composition and Labelling) (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulation 2014 ("the Amendment Regulation") expired at the said Council meeting.
- 3. <u>Members</u> noted the Administration's response [LC Paper CB(2)165/14-15(02)] to members' concerns raised at the last meeting on 20 October 2014. <u>Dr Helena WONG</u> maintained her view that the nutrition labels of infant formula products should provide the maximum level of fluoride allowed to alert consumers about the risk of dental fluorosis.

- 4. <u>The Subcommittee</u> requested the Administration to provide supplementary information on -
  - (a) the justifications for not setting the maximum level of fluoride allowed in infant formula products and not requiring the labelling of the fluoride content of infant formula products; and
  - (b) the current practices adopted by other overseas jurisdictions such as the European Union, the United States, and Singapore regarding the labelling requirements of fluoride content of infant formula products.

(*Post-meeting note:* The Chinese version of the Administration's response was issued to members vide LC Paper CB(2)244/14-15(02) on 10 November 2014.)

- 5. At the request of the Subcommittee, <u>the Administration</u> undertook to revert to the Panel on Food Safety and Environmental Hygiene ("the FSEH Panel") on its progress of work on the following -
  - (a) the results of the sampling tests on the fluoride content in infant

formula to be conducted by the Centre for Food Safety upon the implementation of the Amendment Regulation;

- (b) the enforcement actions to be taken by the Administration against non-compliance cases relating to nutritional composition and nutrition labelling requirements for formula products and prepackaged food for infants and young children under the age of 36 months; and
- (c) the outcome of the comprehensive review of the food-safety-related penalties under the Public Health and Municipal Services Ordinance (Cap. 132) and its subsidiary legislation, as well as the Food Safety Ordinance (Cap. 612) to be conducted by the Administration in 2015.
- 6. <u>The Subcommittee</u> agreed to refer the issues referred in paragraph 5 above to the FSEH Panel for follow up. <u>The Subcommittee</u> completed the scrutiny work and would report to the House Committee on members' deliberations.

		(b) in its survey conducted in 2012, the Centre for Food Safety ("CFS") found that 10 products were provided with nutrition labels showing their fluoride content and the fluoride content of all these 10 products were found to have complied with the Codex Standard.
