### Panel on Administration of Justice and Legal Services

#### Follow-up to meeting on 22 July 2014

At the meeting of the Panel on Administration of Justice and Legal Services on 22 July 2014, Members discussed the item of "Development of mediation services in Hong Kong" and asked the Department of Justice to provide additional information in three areas. This letter sets out the additional information requested for each of these three areas.

## (a) Number of applications for mediation services in respect of disputes relating to consumers in 2013

In the light of the Panel's request, we have enquired, for example, the Hong Kong International Arbitration Centre and the Hong Kong Mediation Centre, and understand that both institutions do not keep separate statistics on the use of mediation for consumer disputes. We have also approached the Joint Mediation Helpline Office ("JMHO"). Whilst the JMHO has kept statistics on the number of applications for mediation services under the category "Goods & Services", there was no application for mediation services under this category in 2013.

(b) Amount of money and time spent by parties to mediation through which the disputes concerned were successfully resolved

The Judiciary has provided in its website some handy statistics from 2011 to 2013 on "average time spent on mediation per case" and "average cost of mediation per case", in respect of mediated cases (with full or partial agreement) which had been commenced before the Court of First Instance and the District Court respectively. The relevant statistics are set out in **Annex A**.

(c) Statistics of mediators accredited by the Hong Kong Mediation Accreditation Association Limited ("HKMAAL") grouped by professional backgrounds

The relevant statistics provided by the HKMAAL are set out at Annex B. As shown by the statistics, mediators accredited by HKMAAL have a diverse background and come from different professions, for example, accountancy, architecture, legal, medical, social work, etc.. The percentage of mediators coming from the legal profession (i.e. mediators under the categories of "Judges", "Barristers" and "Solicitors") constitutes about 42% of all HKMAAL's accredited mediators.


