**12. Comprehensively improving the water quality of the Victoria Harbour**

Members wish to follow up the motion on "Comprehensively improving the water quality of the Victoria Harbour", which was passed at the LegCo meeting on 16 November 2011.

Raised by Dr Helena WONG at the meeting on 10 October 2013. Members are concerned about the odour and poor quality of the water at the sewage outlets along the waterfront and wish to be briefed on Hong Kong's sewage management and maintenance of drainage (including illegal drainage connections).

**13. Review of the "Third Technical Memorandum for Allocation of Emission Allowances in respect of Specified Licences"**

The Administration proposes to brief the Panel on the review of the Third Memorandum following the review on future fuel mix for power generation and submission from the power companies on their plans for new generation units, and to provide a progress update on the implementation and effectiveness of different air quality improvement measures as set out in the "Clean Air Plan for Hong Kong".

- 16. Impact of construction works on endangered species and marine ecology** To be confirmed
- The subject was raised by Mr Christopher CHUNG, Mr CHAN Hak-kan, Mr Steven HO and Dr Kenneth CHAN at the Panel meetings on 16 October and 18 December 2012, 24 June and 10 October 2013 respectively. Members are concerned about the environmental impact of the following construction works and would like to be briefed on the corresponding measures taken by the Administration –
- (a) the impact of construction works on endangered species, including the impact of the construction of the third runway on Chinese white dolphins;
  - (b) the impact of village construction works on butterflies in Fung Yuen;
  - (c) the impact of submarine engineering works, including the laying of submarine cables, on marine ecology and the livelihood of fishermen; and
  - (d) the impact of the large-scale reclamation in the waters of Lantau Island and Lung Kwu Tan on the living environment of Chinese white dolphins (Dr Kenneth CHAN's letter dated 20 June 2013 in LC Paper No. CB(1)1358/12-13(01)).

The Administration proposes to brief the Panel on the

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concerns about the impact of construction works on endangered species, including the impact of construction of the third runway and reclamation in the waters of Lantau Island and Lung Kwu Tan on Chinese white dolphins. Members of the Panel on Economic Development are to be invited to attend the discussion on this item as the construction of the third runway would affect the Chinese white dolphins.

**17. Legislative control on marine pollution** To be confirmed

Pursuant to the discussion on "Controlling the impact of dumping and dredging activities on the marine environment" at the Panel meeting on 14 June 2013, the Administration proposes to brief the Panel on the legislative control on marine pollution arising from oil spillage, marine littering and floating refuse.
