Sir,

I object to the building of the incinerator in Shek K Chau, and my reasons are:

This, Shek K Chau, is a beautiful island by itself. An incinerator on the island will make it beautiful no more. Please find another location, go further out or away, and maybe have a co-operation with Mainland China and have another "burning island" further out, outside Hong Kong boundaries better, a big burner for use not just for Hong Kong and also Mainland China, because they, too, have a same of problem.

The shipping of things or materials for burning, 24-hr burning, will call for a lot ship-movements. Such ship-movements will add up much sea-traffic and will create nuisance and congestion to the surrounding areas, Macau & Hong Kong ferry services, for example.

Viewing the tall burning "Gun" will be eye-soring. Viewing from the areas around Cheung Sha Lower and Upper villages, the area near the turning area, Tung Chung and South Lantau road, where Swire Property now has a big development under construction, will be most affected, adversely. EPD have explained to the residents of Cheung Chau Island that they don't see (or affected) much, since the "Gun" will be blocked by Shek K Chau itself, and that is only true to Cheung Chau but not to the residents of Lantau. What an explanation! Why only to Cheung Chau not to South Lantau Islanders.

Pui O swimming area and Cheung Sha beach will be greatly affected, adversely too. If our Government or the Director of EPD did not think so, please ask him to try to put one incinerator in Repulse Bay Area, Hong Kong Island. One should not rule out the possibility that some day in future the Pui O and Cheung Sha beaches will be so world famous, just like the Repulse Bay.

I have more to say, but I don't think that the Director or our Government will listen, and so, that is it from now.

I am a resident in Chimawan area, Lantu, and I live on Lantau more than 35 years. I know Lantau very much, and so, I know what I am talking about.
