Proposed timing for discussion

1. District Cooling System at the Kai Tak Development

July 2014

The Administration will brief the Panel on the legislative framework of the proposed charging arrangements for the District Cooling System at the Kai Tak Development.

2. Collaboration with Guangdong in improving air quality in the Pearl River Delta region

July 2014

The Administration will brief the Panel on the joint efforts with Guangdong in tackling air quality issues in the Pearl River Delta region, including the latest collaboration initiatives of the two places in response to the State Council's 10 measures in combating Mainland's air pollution.

3. Report on the Subcommittee on Issues relating to Air Noise and Light Pollution

The subject was raised by Ms Cyd HO, Chairman of the Panel. Members wish to be briefed on the progress in those areas which the Administration has given undertakings and those areas which require further action.

The Administration will brief members on the progress of policy initiatives to ban commercial fishing in marine parks.

6. Nature conservation policy

Raised by Dr Kenneth CHAN at the meeting on 16 October 2012. Members would like to be briefed on the latest development on the nature conservation policy.

The Administration proposes to brief the Panel on the public consultation/engagement on the Biodiversity Strategy and Action Plan.

12. Comprehensively improving the water quality of the Victoria Harbour

Members wish to follow up the motion on "Comprehensively improving the water quality of the Victoria Harbour", which was passed at the LegCo meeting on 16 November 2011.

Raised by Dr Helena WONG at the meeting on 10 October 2013. Members are concerned about the odour and poor quality of the water at the sewage outlets along the waterfront and wish to be briefed on Hong Kong's sewage management and maintenance of drainage (including illegal drainage connections).

[The Administration plans to submit the proposed consultancy study on coastal water quality of Victoria Harbour in the next legislative session and to seek funding approval.]
