## Provision of supplementary information regarding the items of concern raised in the meeting on 28 May 2014

### **Objective**

Regarding the requests raised by the Subcommittee on Integrated Education, this paper aims to provide supplementary information to the items of concern raised by the members and the deputations in the meeting held on 28 May 2014.

Provision of supplementary information with regard to the views and concerns raised

To explore with the Centre for Sign Linguistics and Deaf Studies of the Chinese University of Hong Kong the feasibility of seeking funding support from the Quality Education Fund to sustain the operation of the Sign Bilingualism and Co-enrolment Education Programme

2. After the meeting on 28 May 2014, the Education Bureau contacted the Centre for Sign Linguistics and Deaf Studies (the Centre) of the Chinese University of Hong Kong and suggested that the Centre may seek funding from the Quality Education Fund (QEF)<sup>1</sup> to try out the strategies in supporting students with hearing impairment (HI). The Centre indicated that they would consider the suggestion.
