Proposed timing for discussion

(A) <u>Items proposed by members</u>

1. Long term planning and policy on education

Dr Hon Priscilla LEUNG proposed to discuss the subject in the light of the Administration's population policy. Hon IP Kin-yuen proposed to discuss the planning for the provision of secondary school places. Hon Michael TIEN proposed that the Panel should discuss the establishment of publicly-funded schools in Shenzhen offering the Hong Kong curriculum. To be confirmed

The Panel had discussed issues related to the shortfall in primary school places in the North District on 7 February 2013 and the current arrangements under the Secondary School Places Allocation System on 9 July 2013.

2. Employment opportunities for young teachers

Item proposed by Hon IP Kin-yuen. Issues related to employment opportunities for young teachers had been discussed on 10 and 22 June 2013 when the Panel discussed teachers employed on fixed-term contracts and the class-to-teacher ratio in secondary schools.

3. Non-Joint University Programmes Admission System

Item proposed by Hon IP Kin-yuen. Questions on this subject had been raised by Hon IP Kin-yuen at the Council meetings on 20 February 2013 and 8 January 2014. Dr Hon Kenneth CHAN has proposed that the Panel should follow up the subject.

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4. Issues related to the admission of non-local students to University Grants Committee-funded postgraduate programmes

Item proposed by Dr Hon Helena WONG who was concerned about the intake of a large number of non-local students to publicly-funded postgraduate programmes, and ways to ensure that local students would not be disadvantaged.

5. Issues related to the governance and regulation of the self-financing post-secondary sector

Item proposed by Dr Hon Helena WONG who was also concerned about the establishment of an oversight body for the self-financing post-secondary sector. The subject of self-financing post-secondary education was last discussed at the meetings on 11 and 14 January 2013.

6. Measures to address issues arising from the drop in secondary student population

Item proposed by Hon IP Kin-yuen. Issues related to the subject had been discussed at several meetings including those held on 2 and 3 November 2012, 17 April and 9 July 2013.

Item proposed by Hon IP Kin-yuen and Hon Cyd HO. Issues related to the review of School Building Programme were last discussed at the meetings on 30 May and 24 October 2005. The most recent information note concerning a proposed project of a special school was circulated to the Panel in December 2009.

Item proposed by Hon IP Kin-yuen. Dr Hon Priscilla LEUNG suggested that the Panel should discuss the review of the curriculum and assessment of the Liberal Studies subject. The progress of the review of the New Senior Secondary curriculum and assessment, notably the short-term recommendations, was last discussed on 30 May 2013.

11. Class-to-teacher ratio in primary and secondary schools and small class teaching in secondary schools

Item proposed by Hon IP Kin-yuen and Hon Abraham SHEK. Issues related to the class-to-teacher ratio and teacher-to-student ratio had been discussed on 10 and 22 June 2013, while issues related to small class teaching had been discussed at several meetings including those held on 2 and 3 November 2012 and 17 April 2013.

Members requested UGC to provide updated complaint/grievance handling flow charts of individual institutions and the institutions' responses to the UGC's recommendations for the Panel to follow up.

18. Issues related to English proficiency of students and the policies on the teaching and learning of English
