(A) Items proposed by members

1. Long term planning and policy on education

Dr Hon Priscilla LEUNG proposed to discuss the subject in the light of the Administration's population policy. Hon IP Kin-yuen proposed to discuss the planning for the provision of secondary school places. Hon Michael TIEN proposed that the Panel should discuss the establishment of publicly-funded schools in Shenzhen offering the Hong Kong curriculum.

The Panel had discussed issues related to the shortfall in primary school places in the North District on 7 February 2013 and the current arrangements under the Secondary School Places Allocation System on 9 July 2013.

2. Employment opportunities for young teachers

Item proposed by Hon IP Kin-yuen. Issues related to employment opportunities for young teachers had been discussed on 10 and 22 June 2013 when the Panel discussed teachers employed on fixed-term contracts and the class-to-teacher ratio in secondary schools.

4. Textbooks and the use of information technology in education

Dr Hon Fernando CHEUNG was concerned about the rising prices of textbooks. Dr Hon Elizabeth QUAT proposed to hold a joint meeting with Panel on Information Technology and Broadcasting to discuss the use of information technology in education.

The subject of progress of implementing the E-textbook Market development Scheme and the use of E-platforms to facilitate teaching and learning was last discussed on 7 February 2013.

At the meeting held on 9 December 2013, the Panel discussed proposed measures to support schools to adopt e-textbooks to facilitate learning and teaching when the Administration consulted the Panel on the related financial proposal.

The Administration will brief the Panel at the meeting on 9 June 2014 of the consultation document on the Fourth Strategy on Information Technology in Education ("ITE4") and consult the Panel on the proposal to seek Finance Committee's approval of the related funding proposal. The use of e-learning resources and information technology in education will be covered in ITE4.

5. Class-to-teacher ratio in primary and secondary schools and small class teaching in secondary schools

Item proposed by Hon IP Kin-yuen and Hon Abraham SHEK. Issues related to the class-to-teacher ratio and teacher-to-student ratio had been discussed on 10 and 22 June 2013, while issues related to small class teaching had been discussed at several meetings including those held on 2 and 3 November 2012 and 17 April 2013.

9. Grievance procedures of the University Grants Committee ("UGC")-funded institutions

At the meeting on 12 July 2010, UGC briefed members on the guidelines of best practices in redress mechanisms developed by UGC having regard to the findings of the research on grievance procedures of 10 reputable overseas institutions and the responses of local institutions to these best practices. Members requested UGC to provide updated complaint/grievance handling flow charts of individual institutions and the institutions' responses to the UGC's recommendations for the Panel to follow up.
