12. Extension of a supernumerary Administrative Officer Staff Grade C (D2) post holding the post of Assistant Commissioner for Tourism (4) (AC(T)4) in the Tourism Commission created up to 31 December 2014 for three years from 1 January 2015 to 31 December 2017

The AC(T)4 is responsible for providing policy input and co-ordination in promoting the development of cruise tourism in Hong Kong and for overseeing the development and operation of the Hong Kong Disneyland, including its future expansion plans. To sustain Hong Kong's position as a leading tourist destination, the Administration considers that there is an operational need to extend the post of AC(T)4 for three years from 1 January 2015 to 31 December 2017.

13. Proposed amendments to the civil aviation legislation relating to the investigation of accidents

To brief members on the proposed legislative amendments which seek to implement the latest requirements promulgated by the International Civil Aviation Organization.

14. Lei Yue Mun Waterfront Enhancement Project

To consult members on the project to enhance the attractiveness of Lei Yue Mun (LYM) as a popular tourism spot through further improving the facilities along the LYM waterfront area.

15. Implementation of the Trade Descriptions (Unfair Trade Practices) (Amendment) Ordinance 2012

To report on the progress of the implementation of the Trade Descriptions (Unfair Trade Practices) (Amendment) Ordinance 2012 since its commencement on 19 July 2013.

16. Updates on the Third Runway Project in the Hong Kong International Airport

To update the Panel on the progress of the statutory environmental impact assessments (EIA), scheme designs, funding proposals as well as public engagement initiatives in relation to the Third Runway Project.

Hon LEE Wing-tat proposed that the Scheme of Airport Charges should be improved with a view to minimizing the noise impact of aircraft on the neighbourhood of the Hong Kong International Airport. The Administration has proposed to discuss the matter together with the updates on the proposed Third Runway Project when more information on the EIA is available.

17. Update on the operation of the Kai Tak Cruise Terminal

Proposed by Hon Ronny TONG at the meeting on 10 October 2013. The Administration's paper (LC Paper No. CB(1)374/13-14(01) providing updates on the operation of the Kai Tak Cruise Terminal including the Administration's response to the concern of Friends of the Earth (HK) and Clean Air Network about the facilities for on-shore power at the Terminal in their submission (LC Paper No. CB(1)157/13-14(01)) was issued on 21 November 2013.

18. Overall planning of tourism infrastructures and relevant support measures

At the meeting of the Panel on Development on 14 October 2010, Hon Paul TSE cited the effort of the government of Singapore in the development of Sentosa into a tourist attraction and commented that the Administration should take the lead in the overall planning of tourism infrastructure in Hong Kong.

The Chairman of the Panel on Economic Development in the 2011-2012 session agreed to include the item in this list as planning of tourism infrastructure is led by the Commerce and Economic Development Bureau.

The Administration has been requested to report on the progress in developing new tourist attractions and, where appropriate, on measures being taken to address concerns about taxi scams, the operation of the SkyPier and the Security Bureau's Outbound Travel Alert System.

At the meeting on 16 October 2012, Hon CHAN Han-pan requested that the Administration should provide information on the development of ancillary facilities for the various tourist spots.

The Administration advised that it would include details of the relevant ancillary facilities when it briefed the Panel on individual tourism projects, e.g. the cruise terminal at Kai Tak, the Ocean Park and Hong Kong Disneyland projects.

19. Ocean Park's admission price adjustment

Hon TANG Ka-piu wrote to the Panel Chairman on 3 July 2013 expressing concern about the admission price adjustment of the Ocean Park and the Administration provided a written response to the letter on 16 July 2013 (LC Papers Nos. CB(1)1554/12-13(01) and (02)). The Panel agreed to include the item in this list at the meeting on 22 July 2013.

20. Licensing and regulation of low cost carriers

Proposed by Hon Dennis KWOK at the meeting on 10 October 2013. The Administration's paper in respect of the operation of low-cost carriers in Hong Kong (LC Paper No. CB(1)1809/12-13(02)) provided in response to Hon KWOK's earlier letter on the subject was issued on 18 September 2013.

21. Logistics development

At the meeting on 28 March 2011, Hon Miriam LAU requested the Administration to brief the Panel on the implementation of the National Twelfth Five-year (12-5) Plan, in particular further development of Hong Kong as a shipping centre and logistics hub.

At the meeting on 13 October 2011, Hon Miriam LAU expressed concern about the slow progress in developing the logistics cluster in Kwai Tsing area as reported in the 2011-2012 Policy Address.

At the meeting on 16 October 2012, Hon Michael TIEN requested that the Administration should provide information on the comparison of the logistics facilities of Hong Kong and other cities in the Pearl River Delta.

(Note: The Administration has suggested that issues under this item be discussed after the findings of the Study on the Strategic Development Plan for Hong Kong Port 2030 and feasibility study for the proposed development of Container Terminal 10 at Southwest Tsing Yi are available.)

22. Pilot scheme on cross-boundary sailing for pleasure vessels

Proposed by Hon Tanya CHAN and Hon Emily LAU at the meeting on 26 March 2012.

(Note: As the Administration has advised that it does not have a policy on the subject, it is recommended that the item be removed from the list.)

23. Policies and measures for tackling anti-competitive activities to ensure a level playing field

Proposed by Hon Ronny TONG at the meeting on 28 November 2011 who was concerned about the widely reported incident in which large supermarket chains allegedly forced suppliers of beverage products to withhold their supplies to small retailers which sold these products to consumers at low prices.

(Note: Hon Ronny TONG suggested at the meeting on 10 October 2013 that this item be removed from the list given the passage of the Competition Ordinance in June 2012.)

24. Annual Report 2009-2010 of the Competition Policy Advisory Group

On 17 December 2010, the Competition Policy Advisory Group published its 12th annual report which reviewed the complaints received in 2009-2010 and outlined the progress of investigation and follow-up actions taken. Hon Emily LAU proposed to include the item in the List for discussion.

(Note: Hon Ronny TONG suggested at the meeting on 10 October 2013 that this item be removed from the list given the passage of the Competition Ordinance in June 2012.)

25. Development of retail facilities for visitors

Proposed by Hon Michael TIEN at the Panel meeting on 25 February 2013 to study the development of integrated hotels and shopping malls in Northwest New Territories or Lantau Island to cater for the need for additional business floor areas for the retail industry arising from the significant increase in visitor arrivals from the Mainland and to promote employment in local communities.

(Note: It is recommended that this item be removed from the list as the Panel on Development has included in its List of outstanding items for discussion the item "Development of an integrated complex with hotels and retail space in Northwest New Territories" proposed by Hon Michael TIEN.)

26. Power supply and impact of fuel cost on electricity tariffs

Proposed by Hon Fred LI and Hon Emily LAU at the meeting on 28 May 2012 expressing concern about the transparency of the tariff adjustment mechanism, the supply and ratio of natural gas for power generation, the carbon emissions standards for the two power companies, the Government's role in this regard, etc.

At the Panel meeting on 11 July 2012, Hon Emily LAU further proposed that the wider issue of power supply should be jointly examined by all relevant Panels in order that all associated factors, including the health impact of air pollution associated with power generation, could be examined holistically.

(Note: The Administration has advised that at the Panel meeting on 11 December 2012, members were provided with detailed analyses of the reasons for the 2013 tariff adjustment. At the meeting on 8 January 2013, members were briefed on the new Gas Supply Agreement of Castle Peak Power Company Limited. The Administration has therefore proposed that the item be removed from this list.)

27. Operation of the local fuel market in a "fast price hike but slow price slash" manner

Proposed by Hon Starry LEE and Hon WONG Ting-kwong at the meeting on 13 October 2011. Hon WONG, in particular, opined that the Administration should examine and explain whether the Competition Bill then under scrutiny could address concerns in this regard.

See Note

(Note: The Administration has advised that the Competition Ordinance was passed in June 2012 and that the Competition Commission has the power under the Ordinance to investigate into competition related complaints, and to bring public enforcement action before the Competition Tribunal. As the Ordinance applies to various sectors, including the auto-fuel market, the Administration proposed that the item be removed from this list.)
