<b>Subject</b>	<b>Proposed timing for discussion</b>
<b>1. Supply Chain of Powdered Formula</b>	June 2014
Item proposed by the Administration.	
Further to the discussion at the meeting on 10 December 2013, the Administration plans to update the Panel on issues relating to the supply chain of powdered formula in June 2014.	
<b>2. Fisheries Development Load Fund – Proposed increase in the approved commitment of the loan capital</b>	June 2014
Item proposed by the Administration.	
The Administration plans to consult the Panel on its proposal to increase the approved commitment of the Loan capital of the Fisheries Development Loan Fund in June 2014.	
<b>3. Supply of live cattle in Hong Kong</b>	June 2014
At the meeting on 28 May 2013, members urged the Government to expeditiously open up the market of imported live cattle, and draw up an implementation timetable as soon as possible. The Panel discussed with the Administration and received views from deputations on the supply of live cattle in Hong Kong at its meeting on 9 July 2013. Members were advised at the meeting that the Administration was exploring with the Ministry of Commerce opening up the business of the live cattle agent to competition. The Administration undertook to report to the Panel as and	

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when there were further developments on the matter.

At the meeting on 10 October 2013, Hon WONG Kwok-hing expressed concern about the progress of the opening up live cattle market and urged the Administration to revert to Panel as early as possible.

The Administration plans to update the Panel on the latest developments on the subject in June 2014.

**4. Private Columbaria Bill**

June/July 2014

Item proposed by the Administration.

On 7 October 2013, the Administration advised the Panel that it intended to roll forward submission of the new Private Columbaria Bill to the Legislative Council ("LegCo") from the fourth quarter of 2013 to the second quarter of 2014. At the meeting held on 10 October 2013, members expressed concern about the Administration's delay in introducing the Bill. The Panel held a special meeting on 19 November 2013 and received views from deputations on the regulation of private columbaria and the supply of public niches.

During the briefing by the Secretary for Food and Health ("SFH") on the Chief Executive's 2014 Policy Address 2014 on 17 January 2014, members were concerned about whether the new initiatives proposed by the Administration could substantially increase the supply of niches in the short- and mid-term. Some members expressed doubt on the efficacy of the district-based columbarium development scheme.

<b>Subject</b>	<b>Proposed timing for discussion</b>
<b>5. Amendments to the Public Health (Animals and Birds) (Animal Traders) Regulations for better regulating pet trading</b>	July 2014

At the meeting held on 13 November 2012, the Panel received deputations' view on the public consultation exercise on the proposed measures to better regulate pet trading in the interest of enhancing animal health and welfare. Members expressed grave concern that the proposed One-off permit might create a loophole for home breeders to abuse the licensing arrangement. They urged the Administration to impose additional and more stringent licensing conditions for the breeding of dogs for sale. They also called on the Administration to extend the scope of licensing to cover cats and other pet animals.

The Panel was briefed on the outcome of the public consultation at its meeting on 16 April 2013. The Panel passed a motion at the meeting urging Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation Department ("AFCD") to issue under its proposed licensing requirements a single animal breeder licence only and which applied to all commercial and private animal breeders and traders, so as to further protect the welfare of animals in Hong Kong.

The Administration plans to brief the Panel on the proposed legislative amendments to the Public Health (Animals and Birds) (Animal Traders) Regulations (Cap. 139B) in July 2014.

<b>6. Rodent Control</b>	July 2014
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Item proposed by the Administration.

The Administration will brief the Panel on Food and Environmental Hygiene Department ("FEHD")'s efforts in rodent prevention and control in July 2014.

<b>Subject</b>	<b>Proposed timing for discussion</b>
<b>7. Development of sustainable agriculture</b>	Second half of 2014
<p>During the briefing by SFH on the Chief Executive's 2013 Policy Address on 21 January 2013, members expressed concern on the lack of a policy on the development of agriculture and dissatisfaction with the Administration's assistance available to the operators of organic farms. At the request of the Panel, the Administration provided a written response to members' concerns in August 2013 (LC Paper No. CB(2)1732/12-13(01)).</p>	
<p>The Panel also received a letter dated 26 July 2013 from Dr Hon Fernando CHEUNG, a non-Panel member, raising his concerns about the Government's policy on the development of agriculture in Hong Kong [LC Paper No. CB(2)1695/12-13(01)]. The Administration's response to Dr Hon CHEUNG's letter was circulated to members vide LC Paper No. CB(2)1695/12-13(02) on 9 August 2013.</p>	
<p>At the meeting on 10 October 2013, the Deputy Chairman and Hon WU Chi-wai expressed similar concern about the development of local agriculture in view of the Administration's development proposals of the Planning and Development Studies on North East New Territories. They requested that the subject of the Government's agricultural policy be discussed at a Panel meeting.</p>	
<p>When the Panel received a briefing by SFH on the Chief Executive's 2014 Policy Address on 17 January 2014, some members expressed concern on the availability of lands for agriculture. During the discussion on the prevention and control of avian influenza at the Panel's special meeting on 29 January 2014, the Administration advised that the public should rethink whether there should still be selling of live poultry in Hong Kong in the long run. Members were concerned about the impact on local poultry farms.</p>	

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At the meeting on 8 April 2014, members agreed to the Chairman's suggestion that the Administration be requested to advance the discussion of the item to the meeting in the second half of 2014.

**8. Improvement of the operating environment of public markets – progress update**

Second half of  
2014

The Panel discussed the Administration's proposal for rental adjustment of public market stalls and the initiatives to improve the operation environment of public market at its meetings on 8 January, 16 April and 9 July 2013, and received views from deputations at one of the meetings. At the meeting on 8 January 2013, the Panel passed a motion moved by Hon WONG Kwok-hing to set up a subcommittee under the Panel to follow up the issue of installation of air-conditioning systems in public markets.

On 5 February 2013, members agreed to set up the Subcommittee on Issues Relating to Public Markets ("the Subcommittee") under the Panel to study and review issues relating to the policy and business environment of public markets, assess the demand for public markets according to the district-based principle, examine the Administration's proposals for the rental adjustment mechanism and air-conditioning charging arrangement for public market stalls and make timely recommendations.

The first meeting of the Subcommittee was held on 25 March 2014. At the meeting, the Administration advised that BMT Asia Pacific was appointed as the consultant to develop proposals for improving the operating environment of public markets. The Administration would report to the Subcommittee on the results of the consultancy study after the consultancy study was completed in mid 2014.

<p>The Administration plans to revert to the Panel on the outcome of the consultancy study in the second half of 2014.</p>	
<p><b>9. Consultation results of the proposed introduction of the pre-market safety assessment on genetically-modified food</b></p>	<p>Second half of 2014</p>
<p>Item proposed by the Administration.</p>	
<p>The Administration plans to brief the Panel on the item in the second half of 2014.</p>	
<p><b>10. Reprovisioning of the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department's Sai Yee Street Environmental Hygiene Offices-cum-Vehicle Depot to Yen Ming Road, West Kowloon reclamation area</b></p>	<p>To be confirmed</p>
<p>Item proposed by the Administration.</p>	
<p>The Administration will brief the Panel on its proposal to reprovise FEHD's Sai Yee Street Vehicle Depot to Yen Ming Road, West Kowloon Reclamation Area when ready. Upon completion of the new vehicle depot, the existing Sai Yee Street Vehicle Depot will be demolished and the site returned to Lands Department.</p>	
<p><b>11. Study on wholesale markets</b></p>	<p>To be confirmed</p>
<p>Item proposed by the Administration.</p>	
<p>The Administration proposes to brief the Panel on the result of the consultancy study on the roles and functions of wholesale markets in Hong Kong as well as the location of five wholesale markets from the perspective of land use and food safety.</p>	

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At the informal meeting on 17 October 2013, the Administration was requested to brief the Panel on the subject in the second quarter of 2014.

**12. Hawkers Policy**

To be confirmed

The Panel received views from deputations on the Government's hawker policy at its special meeting held on 21 June 2013. Members considered it necessary for the Administration to map out a blueprint for the future development of the hawking trade with respect to tourism, local economy and community aspiration, as well as the contribution made by the hawking trade to the improvement of people's livelihood.

At the meeting on 10 October 2013, Dr Hon Kenneth CHAN suggested the Panel to follow up on the subject at a future Panel meeting. On 9 July 2013, members agreed to form the Subcommittee on Hawker Policy under the Panel to study and review hawker policy with the objectives of facilitating the long-term development of the hawker trade and improvement of the management and operating environment of the hawker areas and make timely recommendations. The first meeting of the Subcommittee was held on 15 April 2014.

**13. Issuance of new Itinerant (Frozen Confectionery) Hawker Licence**

To be confirmed

Members noted a submission from a member of the public expressing concern about the progress of the issuance of Itinerant (Frozen Confectionery) Hawker Licence tabled at the meeting on 11 March 2014. At the suggestion of Mr WONG Kwok-hing, members agreed that the Panel to follow up on the subject at a future Panel meeting.

<b>Subject</b>	<b>Proposed timing for discussion</b>
<b>14. Public consultation on the proposed regulatory framework governing veterinary drug residues in food and food animals</b>	To be confirmed
Item proposed by the Administration.	
The Administration is considering measures to strengthen control over veterinary drug residues in food and food animals in order to enhance food safety. It plans to launch a public consultation on the proposed regulatory framework in the first half of 2014.	
<b>15. Proposed permanent food safety laboratory</b>	To be confirmed
Item proposed by the Administration.	
The Administration plans to brief the Panel on a proposal to establish a permanent food safety laboratory under the Government Laboratory to further enhance the testing capacity on food safety related analysis.	
<b>16. Regulating and monitoring the activities of oyster culture in Hong Kong</b>	To be confirmed
At the meeting on 9 February 2010, in the light of the concerns raised by Hon WONG Yung-kan, the Chairman suggested that the issue of regulating and monitoring the activities of oyster culture within Hong Kong waters should be discussed by the Panel at a future meeting.	
During the discussion of the implementation of the Food Safety Ordinance (Cap. 612) at the meeting on 11 July 2012, Hon WONG Yung-kan expressed worry about the over-expansion of oyster culture in Shenzhen Bay and the crimes arisen in the area. He urged the Administration to step up the regulatory measures for	



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oyster culture, including the introduction of a licensing mechanism.	
<b>17. Liquor licensing system in Hong Kong and regulation of upstairs bars</b>	To be confirmed
At the meeting on 10 October 2013, Dr Hon Priscilla LEUNG expressed concern about problems caused by upstairs bars and the Liquor Licensing Board's considerations in assessing liquor licence applications from them. She suggested the Panel to continue to follow up the subject.	
At the meeting on 8 April 2014, members noted the research report on "Liquor licensing system in selected places" prepared by Research Office, Information Services Division of LegCo Secretariat. Hon Tommy CHEUNG suggested the Panel to discuss the subject of liquor licensing system in Hong Kong and to invite deputations from the trade concerned to give views at a future meeting.	
<b>18. Safety of food for pet animals</b>	To be confirmed
Item proposed by Hon CHAN Chi-chuen.	
At the meeting on 10 October 2013, Hon CHAN Chi-chuen suggested that the subject of the safety of food for pet animals be discussed at a future Panel meeting.	
<b>19. Management of stray cattle</b>	To be confirmed
At the meeting on 8 April 2014, members noted that the Administration had provided a written response to Hon Claudia MO's letter dated 17 March 2014 on the programme launched by AFCD to relocate stray cattle	

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on Lantau Island and in Sai Kung. Hon MO considered that the subject of management of stray cattle including the aforementioned programme should be followed by the Panel at a future meeting. She also expressed the hope that deputations would be invited to give views.
