1. Figures on Internet Deception (Paragraph 23 of the Minutes)

There were 3 621 Internet deception cases in 2013 and the total loss was HK\$903.5 million approximately. Among them, 1 449 cases were online business fraud in which a total of around HK\$43.1 million was lost. E-mail scam comprised 1 697 cases in which around HK\$759.8 million was lost. E-banking fraud totalled 40 cases with a loss of around HK\$10.1 million. The remaining 435 cases were online miscellaneous fraud that accounted for a total loss of around HK\$90.5 million.

2. <u>Indecent Assault in MTR Train Compartments (Paragraph 41 of the Minutes)</u>

In response to Dr Elizabeth QUAT's suggestion that the Police should ask MTRC to install CCTVs in more train compartments and to reserve certain compartments for woman passengers only, we had referred her proposal to MTRC. The Police were informed that MTRC had been considering installing CCTVs in new train compartments. MTRC had no immediate plan for designated female train compartments but they had been constantly looking into various measures with a view to preventing crime and ensuring passenger safety.
