Proposed timing for discussion

1. Proposed retention of three supernumerary posts; and extension of internal redeployment of one permanent post in the Hong Kong-Zhuhai-Macao Bridge Hong Kong Project Management Office of the Highways Department ("HyD")

15 November 2013

Proposed by the Administration. The Administration plans to seek support for HyD's application to retain/extend the redeployment of four directorate posts to sustain the implementation of the Hong Kong-Zhuhai-Macao Bridge and related highway infrastructure projects.

2. Central-Wan Chai Bypass and Island Eastern Corridor Link

15 November 2013

Proposed by the Administration. The Administration plans to seek support for the funding application for increase in the approved project estimates of the project.

3. "Universal Accessibility" Programme

15 November 2013

Proposed by the Administration. The Administration plans to seek support for funding application for the financial year 2014-2015 for the block allocation 6101TX for the implementation of the "Universal Accessibility" Programme.

4. Street lighting in Hong Kong

To be confirmed

Proposed by the Administration. The Administration plans to introduce street lighting in Hong Kong, including street lighting supply system, technical specifications on street lighting, design of street lanterns as well as development of street lighting (such as beautification of environment, energy saving as well as

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remote monitoring and control).

5. Regulation of motorcyclists through a graded licence system

Proposed by Mr WONG Kwok-hing in January 2010. Concerned about the recent increase in traffic accidents involving large capacity motorcycles, Mr WONG called for the introduction of a graded licence system to improve regulation of motorcyclists.

The Administration's response was issued vide LC Paper No. CB(1)1535/12-13 (01) on 15 July 2013.

6. Certificate of Particulars of Motor Vehicle

To be confirmed

To propose legislative amendments for improving the arrangements for issuing Certificate of Particulars of Motor Vehicle in order to enhance the privacy protection for registered owners whose particulars are kept in the register and ensure that the personal data of registered vehicle owners contained in the register is properly used.

The item was discussed at the Panel meeting on 11 July 2011.

7. Cycling safety and consultancy study on cycling networks and parking facilities in existing new towns

To be confirmed

The Administration commissioned a consultancy study to review the existing cycle track networks in nine existing new towns. The study would identify deficiencies of the existing cycle track networks, propose remedial measures for improvements, and recommend an implementation programme for the proposed improvement works. The Administration plans to brief the Panel of the findings of the consultancy study upon its completion.

During discussion on "cycling safety" at the meeting on 7 November 2011, Panel members called on the Administration for greater efforts to improve cycling safety, including mandating the requirement of cyclists to wear protective helmets. The Panel agreed that the issue of "cycling safety" should be revisited.

At the meeting on 16 October 2012, some members proposed that the Administration should consider formulating a policy to promote the use of bicycles as a means of transport in Hong Kong.

8. Comprehensive Transport Study

To be confirmed

Proposed by Mr Frankie YICK at the meeting on 16 October 2012. He considered that the Third Comprehensive Transport Study ("CTS") was conducted by the Administration way back in 1997. Due to changes in population and travelling pattern over the period of time, the Administration should conduct the Fourth CTS.

9. Scope of assistance provided under the Traffic Accident Victims Assistance ("TAVA") Scheme

To be confirmed

Proposed by Mr WONG Kwok-hing at the meeting on 16 October 2012. Mr WONG expressed concern that the assistance provided under the TAVA Scheme of the Social Welfare Department only covered traffic accidents involving land transport, excluding any accidents involving sea transport, such as the recent vessel collision incident near Lamma Island. He opined that the Administration should review the scope of assistance provided under the TAVA Scheme.

Following the decision of the Panel at its meeting on 24 May 2013, the Administration has been requested to provide written response on the matter. The Administration's response was issued vide LC Paper No. CB(1)1410/12-13(02) on 27 June 2013.

10. Development of electric and green transport for Hong Kong and consultancy report entitled "Visionary Transport Infrastructure Study 2030"

At the meeting on 5 December 2011, Mr Abraham SHEK proposed to invite representatives of the Hong Kong Construction Association ("HKCA"), which had published a consultancy report entitled "Visionary

The Administration provided a written response to the relevant findings of the report (LC Paper No. CB(1)2459/11-12) in August 2012.

Transport Infrastructure Study 2030", to present the findings of the report at a future meeting.

Members noted that the findings concerning the development of electric and green transport for Hong Kong were relevant to the purview of the Panel and agreed to Mr SHEK's proposal.

11. Review of safety of vessels carrying passengers

To be confirmed

Proposed by Mr WONG Kwok-hing at the meeting on 22 February 2013. Mr WONG requested to discuss the installation of water-tight doors on vessels carrying passengers; and the requirements of the Marine Department regarding safety measures on these vessels. The Administration has been invited to provide response on the matter.

The Administration's response was issued vide LC Paper No. CB(1)603/12-13 on 11 March 2013.

12. Occupational safety protection of professional drivers

To be confirmed

Proposed by Mr TANG Ka-piu. Mr TANG requested to discuss measures to enhance the occupational safety protection of professional drivers.

13. Transport arrangements for cross-boundary students

To be confirmed

Proposed by Mr TANG Ka-piu. Mr TANG requested to discuss the improvement measures of transport arrangements for cross-boundary students.
