I. Election of Chairman and Deputy Chairman (if required)

<u>Mr Christopher CHUNG</u> was elected Chairman of the Joint Subcommittee to Monitor the Implementation of the West Kowloon Cultural District Project ("the Joint Subcommittee") for the 2013-2014 legislative session. <u>Members</u> considered it not necessary to re-elect the Deputy Chairman of the Joint Subcommittee. <u>Mr Alan LEONG</u> agreed to continue to serve as the Deputy Chairman of the Joint Subcommittee in the 2013-2014 legislative session.

II. Matters arising

(LC Paper No. CB(2)358/13-14(01))

2. <u>The Joint Subcommittee</u> deliberated (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).

3. <u>Members</u> noted the list of follow-up actions required of the Administration and the West Kowloon Cultural District Authority ("WKCDA") arising from the discussions of the Joint Subcommittee at its meetings in the 2012-2013 legislative session.

III. Update on the progress of the West Kowloon Cultural District development

(LC Paper Nos. CB(2)358/13-14(02)-(04))

4. At the invitation of the Chairman, <u>Permanent Secretary for Home</u> <u>Affairs and Chief Executive Officer of WKCDA</u> briefed members on the progress of the West Kowloon Cultural District ("WKCD") development, details of which were set out in the relevant paper. With the aid of a powerpoint presentation, <u>Executive Director</u>, <u>Project Delivery and Executive</u> <u>Director</u>, <u>M+ of WKCDA</u> introduced the key facilities in Xiqu Centre and the space and general accommodation distribution in M+.

(*Post-meeting note*: The powerpoint presentation material provided by WKCDA was issued to members vide LC Paper No. CB(2)406/13-14(01) on 29 November 2013.)

- WKCDA 5. <u>The Joint Subcommittee</u> requested WKCDA to -
 - (a) clarify whether M+ would be a cluster of three buildings as shown in the powerpoint presentation given by WKCDA, and if so, provide a schematic illustration of the building cluster including the appearance of the two buildings behind the main museum building and advise their respective uses; and

(b) provide more information on details of the architectural design of M+, including the material(s) and colour(s) to be used for the external walls of the museum building to manifest the architectural style and aesthetic of the chosen design of M+, which featured a semi-transparent appearance according to the powerpoint presentation materials provided by WKCDA.

6. <u>The Deputy Chairman</u> expressed the view that the Administration and WKCDA should enhance the functions of the Consultation Panel of WKCDA so that it would perform a role similar to that of Metropoli-30 of the Abandoibarra project in Bilbao of Spain, details of which were set out in the reports of the former Subcommittee on West Kowloon Cultural District Development formed in the Third Legislative Council ("the former Subcommittee") on its duty visit to Bilbao of Spain in September 2005. To facilitate members' understanding, <u>the Chairman</u> directed that relevant information be provided to members for reference.

(*Post-meeting note*: The relevant information was issued to members vide LC Paper No. CB(2)510/13-14 on 12 December 2013.)

IV. Any other business

Site visit to WKCD

7. <u>Members</u> noted that pursuant to the decision of the Joint Subcommittee at its meeting on 10 July 2013, a site visit to WKCD had been scheduled for 17 December 2013 to enable members to have a better understanding of the connectivity of WKCD with its surrounding areas. <u>Members</u> raised no objection to inviting non-Subcommittee members to join the visit.

8. <u>Members</u> agreed that the Joint Subcommittee would discuss the following items at its next meeting tentatively scheduled to be held in January 2014 -

- (a) Minor relaxation of the development intensity of the WKCD site; and
- (b) Progress on Arts Pavilion.

The seating capacity of the main theatre was proposed with reference to that of other Cantonese opera performance venues in Hong Kong (e.g. the Sunbeam Theatre), and was considered ideal for xiqu performances by the local xiqu community; (b) noting that a medium-sized theatre with 600 seats for Cantonese opera performances would be provided at the Ko Shan Theatre New Wing which was scheduled to open in 2014, WKCDA planned to develop the small theatre of Xiqu Centre in its phase 2 development; (c) the tea house in Xiqu Centre comprised two parts, which could be used for xiqu performances for up to 200 and 80 audiences respectively; and 	

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		 (d) while MPV was intended to be developed as an indoor rather than an outdoor seated facility for large-scale music performances and entertainment events, consideration was being given to providing an open-air performance venue in the Park of WKCD.

	Admin	 (a) the Administration and WKCDA should exercise proper cost control in developing individual facilities in WKCD and ensure the implementation of the WKCD project in a timely manner and without delay; 	
		 (b) the Administration and WKCDA should respond to the concern of local arts groups/artists about whether they could access the future performing arts ("PA") venues in WKCD and how such venues would be managed; 	
		 (c) the admission fees to the arts and cultural facilities in WKCD should be set at reasonably affordable levels, so as to encourage the public's participation in arts and cultural programmes; and 	
		 (d) noting the Administration's plan to develop a new cultural centre in Kwun Tong, the Administration should brief the Joint Subcommittee on its coordination with WKCDA in the development and management of performance venues in Hong Kong. 	
		The Administration's advice that –	
		 (a) discussions had been initiated among WKCDA, the Leisure and Cultural Services Department ("LCSD") and different PA groups on issues relating to the future use and management of the PA venues in WKCD, including the feasibility of implementing a partnership framework at individual venues in WKCD, with a view to putting in place appropriate arrangements for individual PA venues in WKCD before their scheduled completion in phases; and 	
		 (b) a Cross District Community Cultural Centre ("CDCCC") in Kowloon East was under active planning. Recognizing that it had been a long-standing request of the local community for a new performance venue in 	

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		Kowloon East, which was currently served by Ngau Chi Wan Civic Centre only, the Administration hoped to seek funding to implement the project as soon as possible. As the proposed CDCCC would be located in Kowloon East and was planned to cater mainly for the needs of the residents in the districts, there would be no direct competition between CDCCC in Kowloon East and the future PA venues in WKCD.	
		WKCDA's response that it had all along attached great importance to cost control when developing the WKCD facilities and it would maintain liaison with LCSD on the development of CDCCC in Kowloon East.	
		Suggestion of Ms Emily LAU and the Chairman that issues relating to the coordination and delineation of responsibility between the Government and WKCDA in the development and management of PA venues in Hong Kong be discussed by the Joint Subcommittee at a future meeting.

		WKCDA's advice that –	
		 (a) having considered the design of Xiqu Centre with an atrium and on the advice of retail experts, a reduction of the floor area of the RDE facilities in Xiqu Centre was proposed with the aim of enhancing the overall efficiency of the provision of RDE facilities in WKCD; and 	
		(b) there was no inherent contradiction between the proposed reduction of the floor area of RDE facilities in Xiqu Centre and the proposed minor relaxation of the total GFA restriction of the WKCD site, as the former proposal sought to reduce a small amount of less efficient RDE area in a specific facility in WKCD, whereas the latter proposal aimed to increase the overall provision of the floor area for various uses, including RDE facilities, across the WKCD site. The	

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		rental proceeds from the RDE facilities, which would be incorporated in the arts and cultural facilities, hotel/office/residential ("HOR") developments as well as other facilities in WKCD, would provide a major source of recurrent income for WKCDA to run the facilities in WKCD.

		(b) the provision of public space was an important component in the design of Xiqu Centre and the design team did not envisage any problems with the provision of appropriate ventilation and air-conditioning in the facility; and	
		(c) while the contract for the foundation works of Xiqu Centre had been awarded and the	

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		related works were underway, the tender out date for the main construction contract was scheduled for the first quarter of 2014 with target completion in 2016.
