Item No. 1 – FCR(2014-15)49

The meeting continued deliberation on the item.

## Contract management and termination

- 2. In response to queries raised by Mr LEUNG Kwok-hung and Mr Albert CHAN, Secretary for Environment ("SEN") and Deputy Director of Environmental Protection (2) ("DDEP(2)") said that the contract of the Design-Build-Operate ("DBO") scheme contained various clauses to ensure the contractor's strict compliance with contract terms set out by the Administration. DDEP(2) also said that there were provisions in the Organic Waste Treatment Facility ("OWTF") phase 1 contract which allowed the Government to terminate the DBO contract if the operator failed to perform or persisted in breaching the requirements under the contract. The Government could terminate the contract with the operator by serving a three-month notice. However, this would apply to extraordinary circumstances such as when the operator had serious financial problems, or when it ceased operation without a reason.
- 3. Mr LEUNG Kwok-hung queried if the Administration had to terminate the whole DBO contract due to a serious breach of contract terms during the design or construction phase so that the operator would not be allowed to continue to operate the OWTF phase I. DDEP(2) confirmed that if the DBO contract was terminated during the construction stage, the whole contract including the operation part would be cancelled. SEN said that the DBO contract would be managed in accordance with prevailing standard practices and procedures including those that dealt with different situations arising from the implementation of a project.

#### Other concerns

4. Mr Albert CHAN and Mr LEUNG Kwok-hung shared the concern that the DBO scheme would promote the formation of cartels in the environmental protection business, and asked the Administration on how to ensure that the industry would not be monopolized by a few large firms. Mr LEUNG expressed dissatisfaction towards the OWTF phase I which would process organic waste generated by commerce and industry for free. SEN replied that there were ample opportunities for companies in environmental

protection to participate in organic waste projects by the Administration, and the current proposal required businesses to pay for the transportation of organic waste to OWTF phase I, which was in line with the user-pays principle adopted for waste treatment.

- Mr Gary FAN expressed opposition to the use of anaerobic digestion 5. for OWTF phase I on the ground that based on research in the United States, it was an expensive means in processing organic waste. He asked the Administration to elaborate on its assessment conducted on selecting an approach for organic waste treatment, including assessment of processing SEN replied that the present choice of capacity of private operators. technology was suitable for the local circumstances in Hong Kong, and overseas examples were not directly comparable. He also said that a thorough assessment was done to select an appropriate approach to processing organic Assistant Director (Nature Conservation and waste in OWTF phase I. Infrastructure Planning) ("AD(NC&IP)") supplemented that the Administration conducted a feasibility study and an environmental impact assessment in respect of the project in 2008, and consulted the Panel on Environment in 2010 and 2014.
- 6. Mr LEUNG Kwok-hung requested the Administration to explain the current charging scheme of the OWTF phase I. DDEP(2) said that while organic waste disposal at OWTF phase I would not charge the user a fee, the user would be fully responsible for the transportation cost of organic waste. SEN added that the charging policy of OWTF phase I was in line with the prevailing policy on general refuse disposal, under which landfills did not charge the users.
- 7. In response to Mr Alan LEONG's enquiry about the provision for contingencies in the cost of FCR(2014-15)49, <u>AD(NC&IP)</u> said that the Administration would phase the provision over the period of the project on a pro-rata basis as set out in the paper and could provide further details to the Committee if required.

# Motions proposed by members pursuant to paragraph 37A of the Finance Committee Procedure

8. There being no further questions raised by members, the Chairman said that that the meeting would proceed to deal with motions from members to express views on the item FCR(2014-15)49 under paragraph 37A of the Finance Committee Procedure. The Chairman said that 40 proposed motions had been received and ordered that the meeting be suspended for 20 minutes in order that he could consider with the Secretariat on how to deal with the motions.

- 9. The meeting was suspended at 5:30 pm and resumed at 5:50 pm.
- 10. <u>The Chairman</u> put to vote the question that the motion proposed by Mr LEUNG Kwok-hung numbered 1 be proceeded forthwith. As requested by members, the division bell was rung for five minutes for the division. With the agreement of the Chairman, <u>Mr LEUNG Kwok-hung</u> read out his proposed motion before members voted on the question. <u>The Chairman</u> declared that the question was negatived.
- 11. Mr IP Kwok-him moved to shorten the duration of the division bell to one minute in the event of further divisions being claimed in respect of any motions on questions under the same agenda item. As no member requested to speak on Mr IP's motion, the Chairman put the motion to vote. At the request of members, the Chairman ordered a division, and the division bell was rung for five minutes. The Chairman declared that the Committee passed the motion, and the duration of the division bell would henceforth be shortened to one minute.
- 12. The Chairman put to vote, one by one, the questions that the motions proposed by Mr LEUNG Kwok-hung numbered 2 to 10 be proceeded forthwith. As requested by members, the Chairman ordered a division for each of the proposed motions, and the division bell was rung for one minute for each division. With the agreement of the Chairman, Mr LEUNG Kwok-hung read out each of his proposed motions during the ringing of the division bell. All the questions were negatived.
- 13. The Chairman put to vote, one by one, the questions that the motions proposed by Mr Albert CHAN numbered 11 to 35 be proceeded forthwith. As requested by members, the Chairman ordered a division for each of the proposed motions, and the division bell was rung for one minute for each division. With the agreement of the Chairman, Mr Albert CHAN read out his proposed motions during the ringing of the division bell. All the questions were negatived.
- 14. The Chairman put to vote, one by one, the questions that the motions proposed by Mr Gary FAN numbered 36 to 40 be proceeded forthwith. As requested by members, the Chairman ordered a division for each of the proposed motions, and the division bell was rung for one minute for each division. With the agreement of the Chairman, Mr Gary FAN read out his proposed motions during the ringing of the division bell. All the questions were negatived.

- 17. The Chairman said that as the four proposals in FCR(14-15)31A, FCR(14-15)32A, FCR(14-15)33A and FCR(14-15)34A were all related to waste disposal, the discussion of the four items would be combined but the items would be voted on separately at the meeting.
- 18. <u>Mr YIU Si-wing</u>, <u>Mr IP Kwok-him</u>, <u>Mr CHAN Kam-lam</u> and <u>Mr James TIEN</u> spoke in support of the Chairman's proposal on the combined discussion of the four items on the ground that the items were all related to refuse disposal and had been extensively deliberated in the Panel on Environment and the Public Works Sub-committee.
- 19. Mr Albert CHAN, Mr KWOK Ka-ki, Mr Gary FAN, Dr Kenneth CHAN, Mr LEUNG Kwok-hung and Dr Fernando CHEUNG spoke in opposition of the Chairman's proposal on the 4 items on the ground that the first three of the four items, i.e. FCR(14-15)31A to FCR(14-15)33A, involved the extension of landfills of different scales and locations with different implications on surrounding areas, and that the proposal on the integrated waste management facilities phase 1 in FCR(14-15)34A was unrelated to the landfill extension proposals. Mr Alan LEONG proposed that the Chairman should extend the duration for individual members to raise questions to five minutes for the first four rounds of questions should the Chairman decide to combine the discussion on the four items.
- 20. <u>The Chairman</u> said that he had taken note of members' views and would inform the meeting of his decision on the arrangement for discussion and voting at the next meeting.
