2. <u>The Chairman</u> declared that the motion was negatived.

Motion to adjourn discussion on item FCR(2015-16)12

- 3. <u>Mr Albert CHAN</u> moved, without notice, a motion under paragraph 39 of the FC Procedure that discussion on FCR(2015-16)12 should be then adjourned. Thereupon the Chairman proposed the question on Mr Albert CHAN's motion to adjourn. <u>The Chairman</u> directed that a member when speaking on the question might not speak more than once and should not make a speech for longer than three minutes.
- 4. At the invitation of the Chairman, <u>Mr Albert CHAN</u> introduced his motion. He questioned the merits of strengthening connections with the Mainland cities by building additional boundary control points ("BCP") and said that further integration with the Mainland was not in Hong Kong's interest.
- 5. Mr Gary FAN, Mr CHAN Chi-chuen, Ms Cyd HO, Mr Alan LEONG, Mr Kenneth LEUNG, Mr LEE Cheuk-yan and Mr LEUNG Yiu-chung spoke in support of the motion. In gist, these members expressed dissatisfaction towards the Administration for directly submitting to the Finance Committee items which had been negatived the Public Works Subcommittee. These members also said that the Administration had not addressed members' questions and queries on the merits of Liantang/Heung Yuen Wai ("LT/HYW") BCP, as well as safeguards against further cost overruns of construction works.

- 6. At the invitation of the Chairman, <u>Permanent Secretary for Development (Works)</u> ("PS(W)") responded that the Administration had conducted a territory-wide assessment on traffic impact of the LT/HYW BCP project. The Administration had also been working closely with the Construction Industry Council to ensure that there was adequate supply of construction labour for capital works projects to be carried out.
- 7. <u>Mr Albert CHAN</u> delivered concluding remarks. <u>The Chairman</u> put the motion to vote. As members claimed a division, the Chairman ordered a division and the division bell was rung for five minutes for the motion. Seventeen members voted in favour and 29 members voted against the motion. The votes of individual members were as follows –

- 8. <u>The Chairman</u> declared that the motion was negatived.
- 9. The Committee continued with the joint discussion on the items FCR(2015-16)11 and FCR(2015-16)12.

Cost overrun of site formation and infrastructure works

- 10. <u>Mr Gary FAN</u> noted that in the LT/HYW BCP project cost estimates, risk premium was provided for the works for ventilation adit and buildings, electrical and mechanical works for the dual two-lane connecting road. He enquired about the need for setting aside such provision since these works were scheduled for implementation towards the end of the construction period of the project and the relevant expenditure should now be predictable.
- 11. <u>Project Manager (New Territories East)</u> ("PM(NTE)") explained that the risk premium would cover aspects such as price hikes due to unforeseen labour shortages and extra remedial measures to address the needs of affected residents at the time when relevant works were carried out.
- 12. <u>Ms Claudia MO</u> considered that the cost overrun of Lung Shan tunnel might be caused by human errors for which the Administration should be held accountable.
- 13. <u>Mr WU Chi-wai</u> enquired about the completion date of the LT/HYW BCP and the possibility of further delays in the implementation of the project, and whether the Administration anticipated any need to seek further supplementary provisions.
- 14. <u>PS(W)</u> said that construction under the works contracts for the LT/HYW BCP were due to complete by the end of 2018 and the Administration would strive to complete the project by that time. However, it would be difficult to make commitment that the Administration could completely rule out the need for supplementary provisions.
- 15. <u>Mr CHAN Chi-chuen</u> enquired about the implications the expiry of tender validation period by August 2015 on the cost of the LT/HYW BCP project.
- 16. <u>PS(W)</u> said that if the aforesaid tender validity was to expire and given the trend of escalating construction prices, the longer was the delay in obtaining the funding required for the project, the more the Government would need to pay to complete the LT/HYW BCP project.

Project scrutiny and audit

- 17. <u>Dr CHIANG Lai-wan</u> sought details on the mechanism for scrutinizing public works projects and for auditing project cost overruns. She called on the Administration to consider implementing a system of auditing public works projects by professionals outside the Government, in particular for overspent works projects.
- 18. <u>PS(W)</u> said that all public works projects are subject to internal audit conducted by a separate team of professionals who were not involved in the projects. He considered that as there was an element of independent auditing in the present system, hiring external auditors for public works projects was unwarranted.
- 19. Pointing out the repeated incidents of overspending in various works projects in recent years, Mr Albert CHAN expressed doubt about the effectiveness of the internal auditing. He recalled that in the 1990s, there had been close coordination across Government departments with a view to tight control of the costs of capital works projects. PS(W) maintained that internal auditing staff in the relevant departments had already exercised due diligence in examining the cost of the LT/HYW BCP project, but could not have foreseen all the risks that had caused overspending that the project now faced.

Price adjustment factors adopted for project estimates

- 20. <u>Mr Kenneth LEUNG</u> sought clarification on the discrepancies between original project estimate and approved project estimate on the 2012 estimation of cash flows and provision for price adjustments in respect of FCR(2015-16)11 (as given in Annex D to PWSC(2014-15)33).
- 21. <u>PM(NTE)</u> said that as all the figures were calculated as money-of-the day prices and delayed cash flows would have to be adjusted upwards by the price adjustment factor, the approved project estimate, which reflected the prices in March 2012, was therefore higher than the original project estimate calculated in September 2011.
- 22. Mr Kenneth LEUNG referred to the cash flow and provision for price adjustment estimated in March 2012 as well as the latest cash flow and provision due to latest project estimate and latest price adjustment factors adopted in October 2014 for the item, and enquired about reason for adopting different price adjustment factors in the two circumstances.

23. <u>PM(NTE)</u> said that the Administration had in place a mechanism to calculate price adjustment factors for all capital works projects according to the latest set of assumptions on the trend movement of price deflator for public sector building and construction output. The price adjustment factors adopted in March 2012 estimate were based on the projected trend movement of price deflator for public sector building and construction output at that time, which were assumed to increase by 5.5% per annum from 2012 onwards. In contrast, the price adjustment factors adopted in October 2014 were based on the trend movement of price deflator for public sector building and construction output projected at that time, which were assumed to increase by 6.0% per annum from 2014 to 2018 and 5.0% per annum from 2019 to 2021.

Labour shortage

- 24. <u>Mr Albert CHAN</u> called on the Administration to address the problem of bunching of multiple Government works projects which had strained labour supply of construction workers. He said that the Administration should review and reprioritize projects to alleviate the stress on the labour market for construction workers.
- 25. Expressing concern about a further rise in labour costs, Mr LEUNG Yiu-chung enquired about the Administration's assessment of the effect on the labour market for professionals and workers caused by demands driven by the construction LT/HYW BCP.
- 26. <u>PS(W)</u> said that the Administration was aware of the prospect of labour shortage in skilled workers and had stepped up its efforts in training up more skilled workers for the market. The Administration would also closely monitor the supply situation of construction workers and, where practicable, streamline the process in construction projects, such as promoting the use of prefabricated parts in the projects.

Traffic impact

27. <u>Ms Cyd HO</u> expressed concern about the LT/HYW BCP's impact on the territory's road networks and asked the Administration to provide information on the Traffic Impact Assessment of the project. <u>PM(NTE)</u> undertook to provide the relevant information after the meeting.

Motion to adjourn further proceedings of the Committee

- 28. <u>Mr Gary FAN</u> moved, without notice, a motion under paragraph 39 of the FC Procedure that further proceedings of the Committee should be then adjourned. Thereupon the Chairman proposed the question on Mr Albert CHAN's motion to adjourn. <u>The Chairman</u> directed that each member, when speaking on the question, could speak once for not more than three minutes.
- 29. At the invitation of the Chairman, <u>Mr Gary FAN</u> introduced his motion.
- 30. Mr Albert CHAN, Mr Kenneth LEUNG, Mr CHAN Chi-chuen, Mr LEUNG Yiu-chung, Ms Claudia MO, Mr Alan LEONG, Mr LEE Cheuk-yan, Mr Albert HO, Dr Kenneth CHAN, Dr Fernando CHEUNG and Ms Cyd HO spoke in support of the motion. In gist, these members expressed dissatisfaction towards the Administration's pushing through the Committee its request for supplementary provisions to cover cost overrun items in the LT/HYW BCP project on grounds of urgency and necessity, without first addressing members' concerns about the cost overruns in the project. These members urged the Administration to provide more thorough explanations and course of actions to remediate the overspending, to conduct value-for-money audit on the overspent items, as well as to reassess the current labour shortage in skilled workers in the construction industry.
- 31. <u>Dr CHIANG Lai-wan</u> spoke in opposition of the motion. She said that it was imperative for the LT/HYW BCP to be completed on time for enhancing connections with the Mainland to benefit from the development of its economy. She also called on the Administration to consider hiring external auditors to review the cost overruns in works projects.
- 32. At the invitation of the Chairman, <u>PS(W)</u> responded that the Administration had endeavoured to address the problem of labour shortage in the construction industry. For example, the recently amended the Construction Workers Registration Ordinance could help in forging a better career prospect for skilled construction workers. With regard to auditing, the Administration had an established mechanism in place to independently review overspending of works projects, and the hiring of external auditors might be considered redundant.
- 33. Mr Gary FAN gave concluding remarks on his motion.
- 34. At 7:08 pm, the Chairman put Mr Gary FAN's motion to vote. The Chairman said that as members had claimed a division and the division bell

would have to be rung for five minutes, there would not be sufficient time to put the motion to vote before the scheduled end time of the meeting at 7:10 pm. He said that under such circumstance, the motion would lapse with the close of the meeting.

- 35. The Chairman declared that the meeting be adjourned.
- 36. The meeting was adjourned at 7:09 pm.
