		Mr Albert CHAN Wai-yip queried the rationale of not transferring the telecommunications and broadcasting portfolios under the Commerce and Economic Development Bureau ("CEDB") to the ITB. He was of the view that the CEDB would have excess capacity and manpower surplus after the transfer of the innovation and technology function to the ITB.	
		The Administration advised that the proposed ITB would focus on the development of innovation and technology in Hong Kong, including the commercialization of R&D deliverables. The Administration considered it undesirable to transfer the telecommunications and broadcasting portfolios to the ITB as they were more related to regulatory and licensing matters.	
		The Administration added that the Communications and Technology Branch of the CEDB would still have to tackle many mammoth tasks after the establishment of the ITB, notably the review of the Telecommunications Ordinance (Cap. 106) and the Broadcasting Ordinance (Cap. 562).	
		Mr Charles Peter MOK shared Mr Albert CHAN Wai-yip's view and opined that the Administration should help facilitate the realization and commercialization of R&D results for translating the technology to marketable products or services. The Administration should also help integrate R&D activities into the industries of Hong Kong. He opined that the Administration should step up effort to explain the need for the establishment of the ITB to Members who were opposed to the

		proposal.  The Administration advised that in fact the officials concerned had explained to individual Members the justifications for establishing the ITB and lobby for their support.	-
		Ms Claudia MO's enquiry and the Administration's response regarding the legislative timetable for the establishment of the ITB. The Administration explained that the process in the FC in respect of the funding and staffing proposals relating to the establishment of the ITB and the legislative process of the proposed resolutions were separate proceedings and the dates of their completion were uncertain. The Administration would continue to strive for the early approval and passage of the relevant proposals and the proposed resolutions by FC and the Legislative Council ("LegCo") within this legislative session.	
		Mr CHUNG Kwok-pan's enquiry and the Administration's response regarding whether the Administration would fine-tune the proposal, e.g. by reconsidering the proposed portfolio of the ITB, in order to improve its chances of being passed by FC and LegCo.	
		The Administration advised that the existing proposal had in fact been thoroughly deliberated on various occasions in the LegCo and its Panels, committees and subcommittees. The Administration considered the existing proposal an appropriate one and had no intention to amend it for the time being. That said, the Administration could review the structure of the ITB and consider transferring other portfolios, say the creative industries portfolio, to the ITB after it was established and operated for a certain period of time.	
		Mr NG Leung-sing and Mr Tony TSE Wai-chuen expressed support for the proposed resolutions, and shared the view that the ITB should be established as soon as possible to spearhead the development of innovation and technology in Hong Kong.
