**Legislative Council Panel on Education  
Follow-up to Meeting on 12 January 2015**

At the meeting of the Legislative Council Panel on Education on 12 January 2015, the Education Bureau (EDB) was requested to provide information on contract teachers employed by schools using cash grants and the employment situation of graduates of the Hong Kong Institute of Education. Our response is set out below.

**Salary and contract renewal of contract teachers employed by schools using cash grants**

The salary and contract period of contract teachers employed by schools using cash grants are determined in accordance with the school-based needs. The EDB has not asked schools to set a specific pay scale for these teachers, nor are they required to provide information on the salary, contract period and terms of employment, etc. of these teachers. Therefore, we are unable to provide statistics on the salary difference between these contract teachers and

regular teachers and the details of contract renewal of the former. Also, we do not have information on whether these contract teachers have served in different schools under different contract terms.
