#### **Proposed timing** for discussion

#### 1. Establishment of a declaration and disclosure system for the physical cross-boundary transportation of currency and bearer negotiable instruments

The Administration intends to brief the Panel on the details of establishing a declaration and disclosure system for the physical cross-boundary transportation of currency and bearer negotiable instruments, pursuant to the relevant international standards on anti-money laundering and counter financing of terrorism set by the Financial Action Task Force.

#### 2. Co-location arrangement at the control point for the **Guangzhou-Shenzhen-Hong Kong Express Rail Link** THB ("XRL")

Item proposed by Hon Dennis KWOK, whose letter on the subject had been circulated to members vide LC Paper No. CB(2)707/12-13 on 27 February 2013. At the meeting on 1 March 2013, members agreed that the subject be discussed at a future meeting. Members also agreed that members of the Panel on Administration of Justice and Legal Services and representatives from the Department of Justice would be invited to attend when the subject was discussed.

The Administration advised co-location that arrangement at the control point concerned was part and parcel of the XRL project spearheaded by the Transport and Housing Bureau (THB), which would provide information to the Panel on Transport on the co-location arrangement of immigration and customs facilities at the control point as part and parcel of the XRL project in due course.

# 3. Use of military sites and implementation of the To be confirmed Garrison Law in Hong Kong

Hon Frederick FUNG raised a question on the review of the use of military sites at the Council meeting of 9 October 2013.

Two referrals from the Public Complaints Office on rezoning a site at the Central waterfront from "Open Space" to "Military use" were circulated to members vide LC Paper No. CB(2)745/13-14 on 22 January 2014.

A letter dated 29 October 2014 from Dr Hon Kenneth CHAN regarding a radar station at Tai Mo Shan and the use of military sites was circulated to members vide LC Paper No. CB(2)209/14-15 on 3 November 2014.

Hon James TO raised a question on the Police's handling of requests for assistance to meetings of committees of District Councils at the Council meeting of 26 March 2014.

#### 6. Replacement of a Jackless Snorkel for the Airport To be confirmed Fire Contingent

FSD proposes to procure a Jackless Snorkel to replace the one (fleet R34) currently deployed at the Sub Airport Fire Station.

#### 7. Redevelopment of Lok Fu staff quarters at 20 Heng March 2015 Lam Street, Kowloon

The proposed project is for the redevelopment of Lok Fu staff quarters at 20 Heng Lam Street, Kowloon, including construction of a quarters block providing 112 quarters units, a multi-function room and other ancillary facilities for the Immigration Department. The Administration plans to consult the Panel on the proposal before submitting it to the Public Works Subcommittee.

# 8. Amendments to Part 1 of the First Schedule to the 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter of Dangerous Drugs Ordinance (Cap. 134) 2015

The Administration plans to consult the Panel on the proposed amendments to Part 1 of the First Schedule to the Dangerous Drugs Ordinance (Cap.134) for enhancing the control on new emerging substances of synthetic cannabinoids and controlling NBOMe compounds.

#### 9. Redevelopment of Kwun Tong staff quarters at 4 May 2015 Tseung Kwan O Road, Kowloon

The proposed project is for the redevelopment of Kwun Tong staff quarters at 4 Tseung Kwan O Road, Kowloon to multi-departmental staff quarters for joint-use among the Immigration Department, Fire Services Department, Customs and Excise Department and Correctional Services Department, including demolition of the existing staff quarters and construction of two quarters blocks providing 448 quarters units, a multi-function room and other ancillary facilities. The Administration plans to consult the Panel on the proposal before submitting it to the Public Works Subcommittee.

#### **10.** Scope of application of section 161 of the Crimes To be confirmed Ordinance (Cap. 200) concerning access to computer with criminal or dishonest intent

Item proposed by Hon Charles MOK vide his letter of 29 October 2014 (LC Paper No. CB(2)185/14-15(01)).

Hon Charles MOK raised questions on access to computer with criminal or dishonest intent at the Council meetings of 24 April 2013 and 5 November 2014 respectively.
