AMUSEMENT RIDES (SAFETY) (FEES) (AMENDMENT) REGULATION 2015

INTRODUCTION

Section 48(1) of the Amusement Rides (Safety) Ordinance (the "Ordinance") empowers the Financial Secretary to make regulations prescribing fees payable under the Ordinance. By virtue of section 3 of the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance (Cap. 1), the Financial Secretary means also the Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury.

2. In exercise of this power, the Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury has made the Amendment Regulation at **Annex A** to revise the fees specified in the Amusement Rides (Safety) (Fees) Regulation (Cap. 449 sub. leg. A) made pursuant to the Ordinance.

BACKGROUND AND ARGUMENTS

- 3. It is government policy that fees charged by the Government should in general be set at levels sufficient to recover the full cost of providing the services. In the 2013-14 Budget Speech, the Financial Secretary emphasized the need to review fees and charges systematically for upholding the "user pays" principle, with priority given to those fees that had not been revised for years and did not directly affect people's livelihood, as well as items which had low cost recovery rates.
- 4. The 15 fee items specified in the Amusement Rides (Safety) (Fees) Regulation (Cap. 449 sub. leg. A) are payable for -
- (a) designation of persons who may exercise the powers under sections 19 and

20 of the Ordinance;

- (b) approval of persons as surveyors, competent persons and qualified persons under section 4 of the Amusement Rides (Safety) (Operation and Maintenance) Regulation (Cap. 449 sub. leg. B);
- (c) amendment to certificates of approval held by surveyors, competent persons and qualified persons under section 5(6) of the Amusement Rides (Safety) (Operation and Maintenance) Regulation (Cap. 449 sub. leg. B);
- (d) approval of commencing the operation of amusement rides under section 10 of the Ordinance; and
- (e) approval of resuming the operation of amusement rides under section 15(2) of the Ordinance.

Details of the 15 fee items are set out at **Annex B.** Of the 15 fee items, 11 of them were last revised on 8 December 2000 and the other 4 items on 8 March 1997.

5. Based on the latest costing review, we propose to increase the existing fees by 5.8% to 20.0% with a view to achieving full cost recovery at 2014-15 price level. Details of the existing and proposed fees are shown at **Annex B.**

AMENDMENT REGULATION

6. The Amendment Regulation that **Annex A** will give effect to the proposed increase in fees as set out at **Annex B**. We propose that the new fees will come into effect on 26 March 2015.

BINDING EFFECT

7. The Amendment Regulation does not affect the current binding effect of the Ordinance and its subsidiary legislation.

EFFICIENCY IMPROVEMENT MEASURES

8. The Electrical and Mechanical Services Department regularly

reviews the work procedures with a view to reducing the cost of its services through efficiency improvement measures, including streamlining work procedures, facilitating electronic submission of documents, enhancing staff training and conducting risk-based inspections. Efficiency savings from these efforts have been factored into the calculation of the costing review.

FINANCIAL AND STAFF IMPLICATIONS

9. If the proposed fee revision is implemented, there will be an estimated increase in revenue of about \$17,000 per annum. There are no staff implications.

ECONOMIC IMPLICATIONS

10. The proposed fee revisions have no direct impact on the daily life of the general public and may only mildly affect owners/operators of amusement rides (e.g. theme park operators). Moreover, as owners of amusement rides only have to pay a **one-off fee for installation/alternation** of the rides (i.e. no regular renewal fee is needed), the proposed revision should have negligible impact on the operating cost of the trade.

PUBLIC CONSULTATION

- 11. We have consulted all existing amusement ride owners on the proposed fee revision. We have received only one objection from a ride owner on the proposed fee revisions in relation to Categories A and B rides, which will be increased from \$200 to \$240 and from \$355 to \$425 respectively. In response, we have clarified with the ride owner the basis and reasons for the adjustment, highlighting that the fees concerned have not been adjusted for over a decade. We have not received any further comment from the ride owner concerned.
- 12. The Legislative Council Panel on Home Affairs noted our proposal in December 2014. Members of the Panel did not raise objection to the proposed fee revision.

PUBLICITY

13. A press release will be issued on the day when the Amendment Regulation is published in the Gazette on 16 January 2015. A spokesman will be made available to answer public enquiries.

- (d) category D means any amusement ride which is permitted to carry 21 or more persons.
