Action

I. Meeting with the Administration

[LC Paper Nos. CB(2)572/15-16(01), CB(2)816/15-16(01), CB(2)909/15-16(01) to (03), CB(2)932/15-16(01) and CB(2)954/15-16(01)

<u>The Bills Committee</u> deliberated (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).

2. <u>The Bills Committee</u> completed the clause-by-clause examination of the Bill at this meeting.

<u>Draft Committee stage amendments ("CSAs") proposed by members</u>

- The Bills Committee noted the draft CSAs proposed Mr SIN Chung-kai, Mr Kenneth LEUNG and Mr Charles Peter MOK in relation to the electorate of the Financial Services functional constituency ("FC"), the Information Technology FC, the Insurance FC and the Finance FC [LC Paper Nos. CB(2)816/15-16(01), CB(2)909/15-16(03) and CB(2)932/15-16(01)]. briefed three members members on their proposed <u>Under Secretary for Constitutional and Mainland Affairs</u> then briefed members on the Administration's response to the proposed CSAs as detailed in its papers Nos. CB(2)909/15-16(02) and CB(2)954/15-16(01)]. Mr Christopher CHEUNG expressed his opposing views to Mr SIN's proposed CSAs.
- 4. <u>Mr SIN Chung-kai</u>, <u>Mr Kenneth LEUNG</u> and <u>Mr Charles Peter MOK</u> requested the Chairman to move their proposed CSAs on behalf of the Bills Committee. <u>Mr SIN</u> further requested the Chairman to put the matter to vote. <u>The Chairman</u> drew members' attention to paragraph 2.21 of the Handbook for Chairmen of Bills Committee before putting the matter to vote. <u>Mr SIN</u> claimed a division of the votes. Clause-by-clause 000252 - 011007	Chairman Administration Mr WONG Yuk-man Senior Assistant Legal Adviser	Part 5 – Amendments relating to documents for appointment of various agents and delivery of documents Clauses 37 to 71 Clause 37 Mr WONG Yuk-man enquired how the notice of appointment of a polling agent and a counting agent in the specified form was to be submitted through electronic means. Specifically, he asked whether a scanned copy of the form could be submitted by email, or whether an e-form would be provided online by the Registration and Electoral Office. He also asked how data security would be protected against unauthorized access. The Administration explained that under the existing arrangement, the notice of appointment must be in the specified form, and delivered by hand, by electronic mail, by facsimile transmission or by post to the Returning Officer ("RO"), at least seven days before the polling day. If the notice of appointment was given on the polling day, it should not be delivered to RO by post. The Administration advised that a candidate might submit either a scanned copy of the form signed by both the candidate and the agent, or an e-form completed online with electronic signature. The Administration advised that information security would be ensured according to the established arrangement of systems administration of the Government.

		Clause 41 The Chairman enquired about the purpose of the proposed amendment to section 64(5)(a) of Cap. 541I to substitute "1 week" with "7 days". The Administration explained that the proposed amendment aimed to enhance the clarity of the provision regarding the time for delivery of a notice of appointment.	
		<u>Part 6 – Amendments relating to</u> <u>postponement or adjournment of election,</u> <u>poll or counting</u>	
		Clause 51 Mr WONG Yuk-man expressed concern about the proposed amendment (under section 1(3)(b) of Schedule 1 to Cap. 541I) to substitute "other occurrence of public danger" with "any danger to public health or safety" and requested the Administration to explain more clearly the meaning of the proposed new wording.	
		The Administration explained that when it conducted consultation with the Panel on Constitutional Affairs in April 2013, there was an enquiry as to whether the existing provisions (provided for postponement of an election and adjournment of poll/count caused by "occurrence of public danger") could cater for the postponement of an election and adjournment of poll or count caused by a major of pollogramment of po	
		adjournment of poll or count caused by a major outbreak of disease. After review, the Administration proposed spelling out more clearly in the law to cater for postponement of an election and adjournment of poll/count owing to an occurrence of public health danger of such severity as to obstruct, disrupt, undermine or seriously affect an election, poll or count. The Administration then introduced the Electoral	
		Legislation (Miscellaneous Amendments) Bill 2014 which included amendments to cater for the postponement of an election and adjournment of poll/count owing to an occurrence of public health danger in relation to the District Council, the Legislative Council and Rural Representative elections. The Bill was passed in July 2014.
