**4. Nature conservation policy**

Members would like to be briefed on the latest development on the nature conservation policy, including the protection of incense trees, the prohibition of illegal ivory trade, the establishment of marine parks and the smuggling of totoaba fish bladders (commonly known as "fish maws").
