Role of Chancellor and Composition of Councils of University Grants Committee-funded Institutions

Purpose

This paper briefs Members on the role of the Chancellor and the composition of the Councils of institutions funded by the University Grants Committee (UGC).

Background

- 2. The eight UGC-funded institutions are all independent autonomous statutory bodies. They have their own governing ordinances and statutes which set out their objectives, functions and governance structure. The legislation provides the institutions with the power and freedom to carry out their objectives and functions.
- 3. The institutions enjoy academic freedom and institutional autonomy under the law. Article 137 of the Basic Law states that "educational institutions of all kinds may retain their autonomy and enjoy academic freedom. They may continue to recruit staff and use teaching materials from outside the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region. ...". Furthermore, Article 34 of the Basic Law states that "Hong Kong residents shall have freedom to engage in academic research, literary and artistic creation, and other cultural activities".
- 4. The UGC also safeguards academic freedom and institutional autonomy. In fact, the roles of the UGC, the Government and the institutions in the higher education sector are clearly defined in the UGC Notes on Procedures. In particular, the Notes on Procedures set out five major areas of institutional autonomy, namely-
 - (a) selection of staff;
 - (b) selection of students;
 - (c) curricula and academic standards;
 - (d) acceptance of research programmes; and

- (e) allocation of funds within the institution.
- 5. While institutions enjoy academic freedom and considerable institutional autonomy in the above areas, the Notes on Procedures also state that this does not exempt institutions from public interests and criticism. In fact, in view of the significant funding the institutions receive in the form of Government subvention, as well as the importance of higher education to the overall development of society, it is incumbent upon the Government and the community at large to have a legitimate interest in the operation of the institutions. Therefore, while the Government and the UGC attach great importance to safeguarding academic freedom and institutional autonomy, institutions are expected to remain committed to transparency and accountability in their operation with due regard to good governance, to ensure that funding is put to appropriate uses that serve the best interests of the community and students.

Role of Chancellor

6. According to the respective ordinances governing the eight UGC-funded institutions, the Chief Executive is the Chancellor to maintain the linkages between the Government and the institutions and to demonstrate the Government's support to the higher education sector. Relevant provisions in the ordinances and statutes of the institutions specify the powers and duties of the Chancellor in order to meet the needs of the institutions. These powers and duties primarily include the conferment of degrees and other academic awards, presiding at congregations, appointment of a portion of Council members, as well as acceptance of annual reports submitted by institutions. This statutory system has been operating effectively over the years.

Composition of Councils

- 7. The respective ordinances and statutes of the eight UGC-funded institutions provide for the composition of their Councils, which shall be their supreme governing bodies. Details of the statutory composition of the Councils of these institutions are set out in the <u>Annex</u>.
- 8. As a matter of fact, the UGC's Higher Education Review Report issued in March 2002 recommended, among others, that each institution carry out a review of the fitness for purpose of its governance and management structures, including the Council. The recommendation was accepted by the Government. With the efforts over the past ten years or so, the institutions have completed the review of governance

structures. Among them, three have concluded that their governance structures are fit for purpose; and four others, following extensive consultations, have submitted to the Legislative Council (LegCo) their proposals for amendments to their ordinances / statutes to change the statutory composition of their Councils. Their proposals have been approved by the LegCo. For the remaining institution, it has completed the review of Council composition and put forward a fit-for-purpose restructuring proposal, with corresponding proposed amendments to its statutes. In sum, all institutions have carried out comprehensive reviews of the statutory composition of their Councils, the results of which ensure that the statutory composition is fit for purpose.

9. The Councils of all the eight UGC-funded institutions consist of a certain number of members appointed by the Government or the Chancellor. All along, appointments are made by the Government on a merit basis, taking into consideration the operation of institutions and the needs of higher education development of Hong Kong, with a view to appointing suitable candidates as Council members in accordance with the respective ordinances of the institutions.
