The Administration/UGC had provided written responses on 25 February, 1 June and 3 July 2015 to the letters from Dr WONG dated 3 February, 14 May and 16 June 2015 respectively concerning the UGC Research Assessment Exercise 2014 and policy on funding support provided to post-secondary institutions by UGC [LC Paper Nos. CB(4)573/14-15(03), CB(4)1103/14-15(02) and CB(4)1280/14-15(02)].
