response (LC Paper No. CB(1)1898/13-14(01) to the submission dated 23 May 2014 from a member of the public (LC Paper No. CB(1)1620/13-14(01)) expressing views on the subject was issued to members on 4 August 2014.

In October 2014, the Director of Audit identified several problems related to the administration of the air traffic control ("ATC") and related services in the Chapter 4 of his Audit Report No. 63, including the delay in implementing the Air Traffic Management System ("ATMS") contract and made relevant recommendations to the Director-General of Civil Aviation.

The Public Accounts Committee ("PAC") subsequently considered the Audit Report and found it, inter alia, appalling and totally unacceptable that the new ATC system which was targeted for commissioning in December 2012 was not yet in operation mainly due to a delay in implementing ATMS contract, while the existing ATC system was approaching the end of its usable life. It also strongly condemned Civil Aviation Department's incompetence and negligence in managing the procurement and implementation of the new ATMS project which had been delayed for at least three-and-a-half years. According to the Administration, it will respond to the PAC's observations and recommendations accordingly.

At the meeting on 15 October 2015, members agreed to the suggestion of Hon Kenneth LEUNG (LC Paper No. CB(4)36/15-16(01)) to discuss issues concerning the safety of ATMS to be deployed for the Hong Kong International Airport.

7. Outcome of the review on Public Cargo Working Areas 23 March 2016

The Administration will brief Panel members on the progress of the review on Public Cargo Working Areas conducted by the Marine Department, and propose the next steps of work.

8. Proposed amendments to the civil aviation legislation relating to the air carriage of dangerous goods 23 March 2016

To brief Panel members on legislative amendment proposals to incorporate in local legislation the latest requirements adopted by the International Maritime Organization as set out in: (i) the International Convention on Standards of Training, Certification and Watchkeeping for Seafarers, 1978, and (ii) Chapter X to the International Convention for the Safety of Life at Sea, 1974, as amended.
