- 1. Co-location arrangement at the control point for the Guangzhou-Shenzhen-Hong Kong Express Rail Link ("XRL")** To be advised by THB

Item proposed by Hon Dennis KWOK, whose letter on the subject had been circulated to members vide LC Paper No. CB(2)707/12-13 on 27 February 2013. At the meeting on 1 March 2013, members agreed that the subject be discussed at a future meeting. Members also agreed that members of the Panel on Administration of Justice and Legal Services and representatives from the Department of Justice would be invited to attend when the subject was discussed.

The Administration advised that co-location arrangement at the control point concerned was part and parcel of the XRL project spearheaded by the Transport and Housing Bureau ("THB"), which would provide information to the Panel on Transport on the co-location arrangement of immigration and customs facilities at the control point as part and parcel of the XRL project in due course.

- 2. Use of military sites and implementation of the Garrison Law in Hong Kong** To be confirmed

The Administration intends to upgrade part of the Customs and Excise Department's departmental quarters project at Tseung Kwan O, Area 123 to Category A. The proposed part to be upgraded is to carry out a pre-construction consultancy services and construction of sewers for the above proposed departmental quarters. The consultancy comprises preliminary and detailed design for the proposed quarters; preparation of tender documents and assessment of tenders; and site investigation works. The Administration intends to consult the Panel on the proposal before submitting it to the Public Works Subcommittee.

**7. Redevelopment of ex-Housing Department Staff  
Quarters in Tin Wan, Aberdeen, Hong Kong**

The proposed project is for the redevelopment of an ex-Housing Department staff quarters in Tin Wan, Aberdeen, Hong Kong, including the construction of a quarters block, a multi-function room and other ancillary facilities for the Correctional Services Department. The Administration intends to brief the Panel on the results of the public consultation and the detailed proposals in respect of implementing the System.

At its meeting on 4 November 2014, the Panel passed a motion urging the Administration, among others, to address the additional psychological pressure borne by police officers due to the Occupy Movement, formulate measures to support frontline police officers and proactively provide them with psychological counselling. The Administration intends to brief the Panel on the training on psychological quality of police officers provided by the Hong Kong Police Force.

At the meeting on 15 October 2015, Hon Michael TIEN suggested that the issue of enactment of legislation against the offence of insulting police officers should also be discussed by the Panel.
