# Legislative Council Panel on Transport "Universal Accessibility" Programme

#### **PURPOSE**

This paper reports on the latest progress of the "Universal Accessibility" (UA) Programme, and consults Members on the proposal of the Government to seek approval from the Finance Committee (FC) of the Legislative Council for an allocation of \$770.90 million in 2016-17 for the block allocation Subhead 6101TX – "Universal Accessibility Programme" under Capital Works Reserve Fund (CWRF) Head 706 – "Highways".

### **BACKGROUND**

- 2. The Government has been installing barrier-free access facilities at public walkways<sup>1</sup> for years. In response to public requests, the Government launched in August 2012 a new policy to expand the programme to retrofit barrier-free access facilities at public walkways, striving to create a "universally accessible" environment in the community to facilitate the access to public walkways by the public. Under the new policy
  - (a) from now on, when considering retrofitting of barrier-free access facilities to existing or newly constructed public walkways, the Government will treat lifts and ramps equally (unless the site conditions dictate one form over another). This is a change from the past practice which gave priority to ramps; and
  - (b) as long as site conditions permit, we will consider installing lifts at walkways where there is already a standard ramp installed. After a lift has been installed, we will evaluate whether to keep the ramp or demolish it for more spacious pavement or to make way for roadside greening.
- 3. With the support of the Panel on Transport and the Panel on Development, the Government obtained approval from the FC in January 2013 to create a new block allocation Subhead 6101TX "Universal Accessibility

i.e. public footbridges, elevated walkways and subways maintained by the Highways Department.

Programme" under CWRF Head 706 – "Highways" to fund the implementation of the UA Programme. We also obtained allocations of \$2.449 million, \$187.272 million, \$567.696 million and \$803.98 million in 2012-13, 2013-14, 2014-15 and 2015-16 respectively to take forward the works projects under the UA Programme.

### **CURRENT PROGRESS**

## Original Programme

- 4. Prior to the announcement of the new policy in August 2012, the Transport and Housing Bureau had been taking forward the "Original Programme" of retrofitting barrier-free access facilities to public walkways in response to the recommendation of the Equal Opportunities Commission. The Highways Department (HyD) obtained approval for Item No. 6167TB from the FC in July 2011<sup>2</sup> for commencing the retrofitting works of barrier-free access facilities for 10 items, and the design for about 180 items (the estimated number of technically feasible items at that time) of barrier-free access facilities under the "Original Programme". The related construction and other costs of these items are now funded by block allocation Subhead 6101TX "Universal Accessibility Programme". The "Original Programme" is currently being implemented as scheduled, with the progress as follows
  - (a) among the 10 items under Item No. 6167TB for which the retrofitting works commenced in 2011 and 2012, nine items have been completed and the remaining one is anticipated to be completed in early 2016; and
  - (b) for the 140 <sup>3</sup> items under block allocation Subhead 6101TX "Universal Accessibility Programme", their design work is either undergoing or completed, and the related retrofitting works have commenced progressively, of which –

We have completed investigations works for about 180 items (the estimated number of technically feasible items at that time), of which 144 items were preliminarily confirmed to be technically feasible with detailed design work commenced. During the course of design, 4 items were confirmed not suitable to be taken forward due to various reasons, including that barrier-free access facilities would be provided in a nearby development project (Footbridge KF39); installation of barrier-free access facility was confirmed unnecessary after having consulted the respective District Council (DC) (Footbridge KF60) and space available on site was inadequate for the construction of the concerned facilities (Footbridges HF100 and HF43). HyD has notified the respective DCs of these situations.

- (i) the retrofitting works for 74 items have commenced, with seven items already completed and most of the remaining items <sup>4</sup> anticipated to be completed progressively from 2015 to 2017;
- (ii) the retrofitting works for 36 items are planned for progressive commencement in 2015-16, and targeted for completion in 2018;
- (iii) the retrofitting works for 13 items are anticipated to commence in 2016-17, and targeted for completion progressively from 2018 onwards; and
- (iv) the retrofitting works for the remaining 17 items will commence as soon as possible upon completion of detailed design and obtaining local support.
- 5. In summary, the retrofitting works for 150 items under the "Original Programme" (the relevant information at <u>Annex I</u>) are currently being implemented as scheduled with works for 16 items already completed. Subject to obtaining the necessary funding allocation, the majority of the items are anticipated to be progressively completed from end 2015 to 2018 as scheduled. For those remaining items, due to various factors such as a longer time required for handling different public opinions, the need to co-ordinate with other works or development projects, and other design and construction problems, their construction works cannot be completed by 2018. Also, the design scheme and implementation programme for some of these items are still being formulated.

## **Expanded Programme**

- 6. When the new policy was announced in August 2012, we invited members of the public to propose other lift locations at public walkways where they considered necessary. Response from the public was overwhelming. Between August and October 2012, there were suggestions for lift installations at about 250 public walkways. In the first half of 2013, we invited all the 18 District Councils (DCs) to prioritise the new items proposed by the public in their districts. Each of the DCs had selected three public walkways for priority implementation (referred to as the "Expanded Programme").
- 7. We have largely completed the technical feasibility studies and investigation work for the 57 priority items<sup>5</sup> selected by the DCs. The Civil

Engineering and Development Department (CEDD) reported the study findings and preliminary proposals for the items to the DCs in the first quarter of 2014. The CEDD has also commenced the detailed design work for those items confirmed technically feasible and supported by the DCs. The concerned retrofitting works have commenced progressively, in summary –

- (a) the retrofitting works for 24 priority items have commenced, targeted for completion progressively from 2017 to 2018;
- (b) the retrofitting works for 25 priority items are planned for progressive commencement in 2015-16, and anticipated to be largely completed in 2018<sup>6</sup>; and
- (c) the retrofitting works of the 8 remaining priority items will commence as soon as possible after the completion of the detailed design and obtaining local support.

- 8. In summary, the 57 priority items under the Expanded Programme are also being implemented as scheduled. Subject to obtaining the necessary funding allocation, most of the retrofitting works items are anticipated to be completed in phases from 2017 to 2018. For those remaining items, due to various factors such as a longer time required for handling different public opinions, the need to co-ordinate with other works or development projects, and other design and construction problems, their construction works cannot be completed by 2018. Also, the design scheme and implementation programme for some of these items are still being formulated.
- 9. For the remaining 145 proposals suggested by the public for retrofitting of lifts<sup>7</sup>, after the implementation of the first batch of priority items is on track, the Government will review the implementation schedule taking into account the progress of works, views of the DCs, market capacity, resources of the departments and opinions of the public, etc.

# Proposals outside the Ambit of the New Policy

- 10. During the invitation of proposals in 2012, we also received about 2 750 proposals outside the ambit of the new policy. They involved about 380 locations, including those walkways managed by the MTR Corporation Limited, the Hong Kong Housing Authority, The Link Real Estate Investment Trust (now renamed "Link Real Estate Investment Trust") and private parties, as well as proposals of hillside escalator and lift systems. After consolidating the relevant information, we have referred the proposals to the relevant organisations for consideration and follow-up. Since some of those public walkways involve more complex issues on land ownership and facilities management, it is not easy to delineate which party should be responsible for the retrofitting of lifts. the same time, we understand the public request for retrofitting of lifts at the The Government will investigate thoroughly and public walkways concerned. consider the relevant factors, so that we can address the issues properly with prudent use of public fund. We will report to the Panel on the conclusion of our investigation when appropriate.
- 11. As regards the proposals of hillside escalator and lift systems which are outside the current ambit of the UA programme, we will consider and handle them in accordance with the existing public works mechanism.

#### FUNDING APPLICATION FROM DEDICATED SOURCE

12. We propose seeking approval from the FC for an allocation of \$770.90 million in 2016-17 from block allocation Subhead 6101TX – "Universal Accessibility Programme" under CWRF Head 706 – "Highways" to fund the Category D projects to be undertaken in the coming financial year. Our proposed funding will be used in 2016-17 for the construction cost for a total of 123 retrofitting items (i.e. those mentioned in paragraph 4(b)(i), (ii) and (iii) above) under the "Original Programme", and the costs of the investigation, design and construction works for 57 priority items (i.e. those mentioned in paragraph 7(a), (b) and (c) above) under the "Expanded Programme".

#### ADVICE SOUGHT

13. Members are invited to comment on the funding proposal. Subject to Members' support, following the procedures of CWRF block allocations, we will consult the Panel on Development on 24 November this year. We will then submit the proposal to the Public Works Subcommittee for discussion and

apply for funding approval for 2016-17 from the FC, with a view to continuing the implementation of the related projects.
