I. Meeting with the Administration

Declaration of interests

The Chairman declared that he was holding a remunerated post in a travel agent. He was also the unremunerated honorary chairmen/advisers of nine tourism related associations. Details were set out in the LC Paper No. CB(4)849/16-17(01).

2. <u>Mr Paul TSE</u> declared that he was a director of a travel agent and an adviser of some tourism associations.

Follow-up actions to be taken by the Administration

- 4. <u>The Administration</u> was requested to, in relation to the amendments proposed by the Administration (LC Paper No. CB(4)1568/17-18),
 - (a) review the drafting of the proposed amendments to clause 64(2) to include in the contents of the register the electronic mail address of a licensee; and
 - (b) amend the English text of new clause 14(9)(a) as "the validity period of a renewed travel agent licence in the licence" to achieve consistency with the Chinese text.
- 5. The Administration was also requested to explain during the resumption of the Second Reading debate on the Bill the administrative measures proposed to ensure that appropriate work insurance policy would be taken out and the premium of which would be borne by a licensed travel agent for a tourist guide/tour escort who provides service for the travel agent in the capacity of self-employed person.

(*Post-meeting note*: The Administration's written response and revised amendments to the Bill were issued to members vide LC Paper Nos. CB(4)50/18-19(02) and CB(4)204/18-19(01) on 19 October and 13 November 2018 respectively.)

Draft amendments to the Travel Industry Bill

- 6. <u>The Bills Committee</u> noted the draft amendments proposed by the Deputy Chairman and the Administration's response to the amendments.
- 7. <u>The Chairman</u> concluded that the Bills Committee had completed the scrutiny of the Bill and raised no objection to the draft amendments proposed by the Administration. The Bills Committee would not propose any amendments to the Bill in its name.
