
Re: Travel Industry Bill

I refer to the Travel Industry Bill (“Bill”) and our previous submissions to the Bills Committee.

At the 18th Bills Committee meeting held on 9 October 2018, a Member suggested amending clause 167 of the Bill with a view to clarifying under what circumstances should a notice or summons required to be served on a licensee under the Bill be regarded as duly served.

167	<p>By deleting the clause and substituting—</p> <p>“167. Service of notices or summonses</p> <p>(1) A notice or summons required to be served on a licensee under this Ordinance is to be regarded as duly served if—</p> <p>(a) it is delivered to the licensee personally; or</p> <p>(b) it is—</p> <p>(i) left at, or sent by post to, the licensee’s correspondence address; and</p> <p>(ii) sent by electronic means to the licensee’s electronic mail address.</p> <p>(2) A notice or summons required to be served on a person other than a licensee under this Ordinance is to be regarded as duly served if—</p> <p>(a) it is delivered to the person personally; or</p> <p>(b) it is—</p> <p>(i) left at, or sent by post to, the person’s last known address (if available); and</p> <p>(ii) sent by electronic means to the person’s last known electronic mail address (if available).”.</p>
