Follow-up actions required of the Administration

Admin 2. The Bills <u>Committee</u> requested the Administration to:

- (a) in respect of the Administration's proposal to, among others, add two seats of registered medical practitioners who were Fellows of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine ("the Academy of Medicine") being nominated and elected by Fellows of the Academy of Medicine in accordance with the Academy of Medicine's regulations or procedures in the composition of the Medical Council of Hong Kong ("the Medical Council"),
 - (i) provide the details, including but not limiting to the scope, period and activities, of the consultation to be conducted by the Academy of Medicine on the proposal; and
 - (ii) advise the Academy of Medicine's target timetable for hammering out the regulations or procedures for nominating and electing two Fellows to hold the offices; and
- (b) advise whether the Administration would revise its draft amendments to section 3(2)(c) and (db) of the Medical Registration Ordinance (Cap. 161) to the effect that the two ex officio members, being the Director of Health or his or her representative and the Chief Executive of the Hospital Authority or his or her representative, had to be registered medical practitioners so as to achieve the legislative intent as set out in paragraph 9 of LC Paper No. CB(2)109/17-18(03)

that registered medical practitioner members would remain to account for three-fourths of the membership of the Medical Council.

In his view, the amendment to be moved by the Administration to the Bill to add a proposed new section 3(2)(ha) to the Medical Registration Ordinance (Cap. 161) ("the Ordinance") to provide for the two proposed seats should be modelled on the existing section 3(2)(j) of the Ordinance whereby no requirements in addition to that related to the membership and residency status of the registered medical practitioner concerned were imposed for the election held for filling the seven registered medical practitioner member seats to be elected by registered medical practitioners with full registration and limited registration.		
		In response to the Chairman's enquiry, the Legal Adviser to the Bills Committee advised that amendments might be considered to be made to include in the Ordinance, or to provide in the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine Ordinance (Cap. 419), the nomination and election arrangements for filling the two proposed seats, in addition to the current proposal contained in the proposed new section 3(2)(ha) of the Ordinance.		
		The Administration's advice that under the principle of professional autonomy, the proposed new section 3(2)(ha) of the Ordinance had provided that the two proposed seats would be filled by Fellows of the Academy of Medicine who were being nominated and elected by Fellows in accordance with the regulations or procedures of the Academy of Medicine. To its understanding, the Academy of Medicine would gauge its Fellows' views on the filling of the two proposed seats through a forum by the end of November 2017. The Council of the Academy of Medicine would then map out the nomination and election mechanism.		
		Dr KWOK Ka-ki's view that it was difficult for Members to decide whether to support the Administration's proposed

		The Chairman's request for the Administration to provide in writing the details of the consultation to be conducted by the Academy of Medicine in this regard, and advise the Academy of Medicine's target timetable for hammering out the regulations or procedures for nominating and electing two Fellows to fill the two proposed seats. 004802 - 011159	Chairman Dr Pierre CHAN Admin Dr KWOK Ka-ki	Making reference to existing section 3(2)(i) of the Ordinance and the existing nomination mechanism for the seven seats of registered medical practitioners who were members of the Hong Kong Medical Association ("the Medical Association") in the Medical Council, Dr Pierre CHAN considered the drafting of the proposed new section 3(2)(ha) of the Ordinance appropriate provided that no additional thresholds would be imposed by the Academy of Medicine on the eligibility to stand for the election, and to nominate and vote in the election for the two proposed seats.	
		Making reference to section 4 of the Medical Practitioners (Electoral Provisions) (Procedure) Regulation (Cap. 161B), Dr KWOK Ka-ki reiterated that no requirements in addition to that related to the membership and residency status of the Fellows concerned should be imposed by the Academy of Medicine on the qualifications for nomination as a candidate for the election of the two proposed seats.	
		The Administration's response that it was up to the Academy of Medicine to decide the nomination and election mechanism for the two proposed seats having regard to the different views held by the Fellows of the Academy of Medicine in this regard.	
		The Chairman's remarks that individual members who intended to propose amendments to the Bill in this regard and wished their amendments to be considered by the Bills Committee should provide their amendments to the Bills Committee as early as possible.

		The Administration advised that the proposed new section 3(2)(ha) of the Ordinance had provided that the two proposed seats should be elected by Fellows of the Academy of Medicine. It would also move an amendment to add a definition of "Fellow" in line with section 2 of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine Ordinance in the proposed section 2 of the Ordinance.

		The Administration's advice that the existing two registered medical practitioners being nominated by the Academy of Medicine and appointed by the Chief Executive to sit on the Medical Council and the two registered medical practitioners who were proposed to be Fellows of the Academy of Medicine being nominated and elected by Fellows of the Academy of Medicine should all be regarded as representatives of the Academy of Medicine on the Medical Council. To uphold professional autonomy, it would be up to the Academy of Medicine to decide how to elect the latter two representatives on the Medical Council.	
		Mr IP Kin-yuen maintained the view that the two registered medical practitioner members who were proposed to be Fellows of the Academy of Medicine being nominated and elected by Fellows to the Medical Council should be accountable to their voters but not the Academy of Medicine since they were to be returned by election.	
013051 - 014646	Chairman Dr KWOK Ka-ki Admin ALA6	Referring to the Administration's draft amendments to section 3(2)(c), (db) and (h) of the Ordinance, Dr KWOK Ka-ki enquired about the reason why the Director of Health (or his or her representative) and the Chief Executive of the Hospital Authority ("HA") (or his or her representative) were not required to be appointed by the Chief Executive while the two registered medical practitioner members being nominated by the Academy of Medicine needed to be appointed by the Chief Executive.	
		The Administration explained that the Director of Health and the Chief Executive of HA were proposed to be ex-officio members in the Medical Council. They held the offices by virtue of their positions and no appointment was required.	
		The Legal Adviser to the Bills Committee's advice that it was possible that the Director of Health and/or the Chief Executive of HA (or their appointed representatives) were not medical practitioners; and Dr KWOK Ka-ki's concern that the professional element in the Medical Council would be reduced if this was the case.
