		The Administration's response that:	
		(a) ICAC was one of the authorized officers under the existing UNATMO to carry out anti-terrorism work. It would be necessary to enable ICAC to use the power under Cap. 204 to deal with the new offences proposed by the Bill;	
		(b) although anti-terrorism work would continue to be led by the Police, there was a need for ICAC to take prompt actions against terrorist activities identified in the course of its investigation of corruption;	
		(c) as far, there had not been any prosecution under UNATMO since its enactment; and
