Dear sir/madam,

I would like to express my opinion of Bills Committee on United Nations (Anti-Terrorism Measures) (Amendment) Bill 2017.

According to The Basic Law of The Hong Kong Special Administrative Region of People's Republic of China Article 31, Hong Kong residents shall have freedom of movement within the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region and freedom of emigration to other countries and regions. They shall have the freedom to travel and to enter or leave the Region. Unless restrained by law, holders of valid travel documents shall be free to leave the Region without special authorization.

Here are some questions about this amendment bill:

- 1) Would Hong Kong citizens discuss Hong Kong Independent on the internet like Facebook, WhatsApp and/or University/Community College, the government would/wouldn't see citizens as the terrorist?
- 2) Would the amendment bill go against the Basic Law of Hong Kong Special Administrative Region?
- 3) If this Amendment Bill sets in Hong Kong, the Hong Kong government will have a document to clarify the definitions of the terms (like the definition of terrorist)?
