**Question:** 

Regarding Reply Serial No. LC042, please advise on the details of the technical problems which make ventilation improvement infeasible. What are the reasons why shower facilities can be provided on 5/F but not on Members' office floors? What is the difference between them? Have other alternative options, apart from Members' office floors, been considered for the provision of shower facilities in the Complex for use by Members' staff? If yes, what are the details; if no, what are the reasons?

#### Reply:

As advised by the Architectural Services Department ("ArchSD"), an additional air duct to extract the very humid air had to be provided from any shower rooms on Members' Office floors to the roof level. As the ceiling voids above Members' Office floors were congested with existing building services such as drainage pipes and structural concrete beams, installation of an air duct through the floors was not feasible. On the other hand, as the shower facilities in the Members' Activity Room on 5/F were provided in the original design of the Legislative Council Complex, an air duct was built in during construction of the Complex. The Secretariat had also requested ArchSD to explore the feasibility of providing shower facilities on G/F of the Complex. Similar to the Members' Office floors, ArchSD had advised that it was technically infeasible owing to the spatial constraint in the ceiling void for ventilation improvement.
